What Does It Mean to Be a Title I School?

- Being a Title I school means receiving federal funding (Title I funds)
 to <u>supplement</u> the school's existing programs. These dollars are
 used for...
 - Identifying students experiencing academic difficulties and providing timely assistance to help them meet the State's challenging content standards.
 - Purchasing supplemental staff/programs/materials/supplies.
 - Conducting parental involvement meetings/trainings/activities.
 - Recruiting/Hiring/Retaining Highly Qualified Teachers.
- Being a Title I school also means encouraging parental involvement and advocating for parents' rights.
