Please Note:

- Students who have an Individualized Education Plan (IEP) must have a TLC consideration meeting with their case manager and TLC staff to ensure the TLC is an appropriate placement for their learning needs.
- Only fully completed applications will be processed.
- The TLC often has a waitlist for student enrollment. Application submission does not guarantee immediate placement.

Eligibility criteria for high school students (age 21 & under), per Minnesota Statute 124D.68 (interested students must meet at least one of the following to apply):

- Performs substantially below the performance level for pupils of the same age
- Is behind in satisfactorily completing coursework or obtaining credits for graduation
- Is pregnant or is a parent
- Has been assessed as chemically abusive and/or dependent
- Has been excluded or expelled
- Has been referred by a school district staff member for enrollment in a nontraditional program
- Has been a victim of physical or sexual abuse
- Has an assessed mental health condition
- Has experienced homelessness within the six months before applying to the TLC
- Speaks English as a second language or has limited English proficiency (LEP)
- Has withdrawn from school or been chronically truant
- Is being treated at a hospital in the metro area for a life-threatening illness

Helpful Information

How the Tokata Learning Center is different from a traditional high school:

- Smaller class sizes
- Extended class times for more in-depth learning and teacher contact
- More individualized attention and personalized instruction
- Little to no homework in regular classes, provided students follow teacher instructions
- Continual Learning Plan for each student that creates a custom path to graduation and success
- Independent study options for students who learn well in this capacity
- Schedule flexibility, allowing us to create a plan for students to start later, end earlier, attend fewer days, and so on, provided students complete all work required (this schedule must be approved before starting at the TLC)

How the Tokata Learning Center is similar to a traditional high school:

- TLC students must meet the same graduation requirements as Shakopee High School students, and receive a Shakopee High School diploma upon satisfactory completion of graduation requirements.
- Licensed teachers facilitate all coursework.
- The curriculum is designed to be challenging and rigorous while remaining achievable for students.
- Students have a variety of options available to them for elective courses.
- Transportation is available to students who live outside a mile and a half radius of the school.
- Behavioral and attendance expectations help students grow into responsible adults.
- Counselors, chemical health specialists, school psychologists, school resource officers, special services staff, and cultural liaisons are all available to students.
- Students can participate in work study courses to earn credit for working at their jobs.
- Shakopee TLC students are able to participate in programs, events and activities at Shakopee High School with pre approval of the SHS principal, including:
 - o Dances (for students enrolled in grades 10-12)
 - o Events outside of school hours, such as football games
 - o Academic/Athletic and Fine Arts activities
 - o Classes

Tokata Learning Center Programs

The Tokata Learning Center offers two different programming options. Please read the descriptions of both, and then on the next page be sure to indicate which program you are applying for.

TLC Core Program

In the TLC Core Program, students engage in 2 - 4 self-directed courses at one time. Students follow a four block schedule, attending lab classrooms where they get instructional support from content teachers. In addition, students participate in daily advisory and flex periods. The advisory period is designed to promote positive relationship building and academic goal setting. The flex period is designed to actively engage students in activities that promote social, emotional, and physical well-being. The TLC Core Program provides students with structures and support that promote independent learning and provide students with opportunities for self agency. Students in the Core Program work to meet three-week academic goals. At the end of each three-week term, staff will share student progress updates with students and families, and then will determine if any additional support and/or interventions are necessary to improve student engagement and learning. The first day of each new term is scheduled to be a Remote Learning Day, meaning students will work from home with afternoon virtual check-in requirements.

TLC Independent Study Requirements

PROGRAM COMPONENTS	TLC INDEPENDENT STUDY COMMITMENTS
Age Requirement	• 16 years of age and older
Academic Requirements	 Work on 1 course at a time. Complete all required content to a level of proficiency (70% +).
Time Requirements	 Students are responsible for attending independent study sessions weekly, which take place from 3:15 - 4:45 PM on Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays in the TLC Bridge space. Students are expected to work on coursework outside of school as much as possible each day (approximately 4 hours).
Communication	Communicate in a timely and responsive manner.
Transportation	No transportation is available for the TLC Independent Study Program.
