# **Independent Reading Choice Board**



#### **Interrogation Time**

Create a 10 question Quiz that asks the audience to analyze the vocabulary within the text.

You may include a mix of multiple choice and short answer questions to analyze the test-taker's understanding of the word choice and significance throughout the story.

#### **Get Critical**

Analyze your book through at least two of the eight critical lenses.

You may choose to write In well-developed paragraphs, or choose another format to present your learning.

#### BookTok

Give a 2-3 minute book talk that includes a summary and review. You may structure it as a video or podcast episode; be sure it is engaging, clear and well organized.

#### **Poetic Conflict**

Write a poem, song (any genre) about how the protagonist has changed over the course of the novel OR about the conflict - including how the conflict was resolved - in the novel. If your poem or song is not fully descriptive, provide an explanation to accompany it.

## **Making Sense**

Identify and explain THREE examples of sensory details within your book.

You may use <u>this handout</u>, or choose another format to present your learning.

#### Storyteller

Retell the story to a very young child in the form of a children's picture book or a comic strip.

Carefully select the vocabulary and use plenty of colourful illustrations. This may be done digitally or on paper.

#### Life Lessons

Write a well-developed paragraph identifying the theme of your book. What message about life did the book deliver?

Be sure to provide evidence, including at least two quotes, to support the theme.

### Dear Diary...

Write six to eight diary entries made by one of the major characters.

Date the entries according to the book.

Your entries should demonstrate how the character changes.

# A Picture is Worth a Thousand Words

Illustrate one page in the book.

Caption your illustration with the page number and a quote from that page.

Attach a one-paragraph plot summary.

#### Why so technical?

Analyze at least 3 of the literary choices the author of your book chooses to make throughout the book.
Focus on literary devices and figurative language.
You may use this handout or choose another format to present your learning.

#### Time is of the Essence

Create an artistic and accurate timeline of major events in the story.

You must have at least ten items on the timeline.

You must also attach a short explanation of the significance of each event.

### Piece it Together

Create a visual collage reflecting the protagonist of the story.

Your collage must have at least ten images. You must also attach a short explanation of the meaning of each image.
This may be done digitally or on paper.
