Can be positive or negative

It's easier to show tone through speech.

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How to determine TONE?

- Ask yourself "How does the author seem to feel about this subject?"
- "Based on the word choice the author feels..."

Tone can be created through:

- Word Choice (Diction)
- Punctuation

The reader's emotions after reading

Can be positive or negative

How to determine MOOD?

- Ask yourself "What is the reader's emotional response to this topic?"
- "How does the author want the reader to feel?"

Mood is developed through the setting, theme, descriptive language, & tone
