

## The Transition to Middle School: What Parents Need to Know

Continue to set a time for homework and stay on top of grades. Don't expect your child to be honest with you about homework. Check power school with your student at least once/week.

Monitor technology. Check sites, block sites and be sure to have their passwords. Treat cell phone and technology as a privilege not a right.

Friendships will vary, sometimes from day to day! Get to know the parents of your child's new friends. Encourage your child to join something they are interested outside of school.

Don't rescue your child from natural consequences. Set boundaries rules and expectations and stick to them. If your child fails a test talk to them first (not the teacher) and hold them accountable. Give your child the opportunity to learn that failure will happen and to learn from their mistakes.

Allow your child to be comfortable with who they are. Don't put pressure on them to be with the cool or popular group. In addition to academic learning your child will also be doing a lot of social/emotional learning over the next 3 years.



### You Are Very Important To Your Child's Success!

- There is a direct relationship between parental involvement and student achievement!
- Parents need get even more involved in the middle school years.
- Parents should maintain strong family connections to students.
- Parents should encourage involvement in school activities such as clubs, athletics, and community service.
- Parents should listen...Seek first to understand your Bronco.

#### What can Parents do for 6th Graders?

- Join the PTSO, volunteer, and be involved in school activities.
- Ensure good attendance and on-time arrival for school each day.
- Check Powerschool Set up "Notifications" for a weekly report
- Talk to your child often about organization, school, grades and friendships
- Check homework and have them study daily. Provide a study area at home.
- Communicate with your child's teachers, counselor, and administrator
- Request Parent Conferences when needed! (These are not automatically scheduled)
- Time Management Have students use their agendas! Write in HW, due dates, events, etc. Help students look at their day and week and plan accordingly.

- REMEMBER THAT MIDDLE SCHOOL STUDENTS ARE DRIVEN BY PERCEPTION AND EMOTIONS THAT CHANGES BY THE MINUTE...TALK THROUGH THINGS WITH THEM AND DISCUSS SOLUTIONS THAT THEY CAN PUT INTO PRACTICE.

Don't always rescue them...it's ok to fail, fall, or forget things.

- When in doubt, ask questions!
- Connect to other parents.
