  - the results of the annual review meeting from last spring,
  - what instructional activities students will be involved in,
  - how children will be assessed to determine growth,
  - how and when the assessment information will be sent home to the parents

This meeting will also give parents the opportunity to actively participate and have input into the Title 1 School wide program.
