Pattern

• is an underlying structure that organizes surfaces or structures in a consistent, regular manner. **Pattern** can be described as a repeating unit of shape or form, but it can also be thought of as the "skeleton" that organizes the parts of a composition.

Repetition


 Refers to one object or shape repeated; pattern is a combination of elements or shapes repeated in a recurring and regular arrangement; rhythm--is a combination of elements repeated, but with variations.



- Create order, color cohesion and visual impact



 Create a multi-colored pattern using ONLY typographic characters (letters, numbers, punctuation marks).






8 x 11 Make 6 Mini Type Patterns
















Pick 3 8 x 11 file create 3--2 x 10 rows of pattern




- Create a New Document
