

Inclement Weather Procedures & Skylert Notification System: The decision to close school or open two hours later will be announced

before 7:00 AM on the CLSD Home page, www.clsd.k12.pa.us, as well as on the Cornwall-Lebanon School District Facebook and Twitter pages (@CLSD_Schools), and on local radio and TV stations. The Skylert automated notification system also will be used to contact parents/guardians during the school day in the event of a building power failure, hazardous situation, or an early dismissal. Please review the important information that is printed inside the front cover of the CLSD 2019-20 Calendar of Events. The District website is the first place important information is posted. Please, do not contact school or District offices in the case of these events as it is important for our phone lines to be available for emergency communications.

Remember, the Skylert notification system is only as accurate as the information you have provided to the District. Be sure your phone and email settings allow (does not Block) these numbers: (717) 272-2031 and (717) 389-1810, and emails from @clsd.k12.pa.us addresses. Please review your information and make any updates in Skylert (for general information sharing, including school closings):

- 1. Login to your Skyward account.
- 2. Click the word "Skylert" in the left menu.
- 3. Fill-in and check or uncheck your desired settings.
- 4. Click "SAVE" in the upper right side of the page when you are done.

Student Report Card/Progress Report Clarification

Parents/Guardians:

Understanding your child's academic reporting may be difficult. Below is some explanation and examples for you. If you have any other questions or concerns please reach out to your child's teacher. Thank you!

Grades K - 2 Example

Period 6 - Math 1 (1 Math/2)

This indicates grade, subject and section number. The section number is simply an identification code skyward uses to attribute the student to a teacher.

Unit 1 Numbers and Operations
This indicates what unit of study

Extend the counting sequence to read and write numerals to represent objects T1 - P This indicates the sub skill taught within Unit 1 Numbers and Operations

T1 - P indicates it is Term 1 and P indicates mastery level

(P – proficient, D – developing, NI – needs improvement, SI – shows improvement)

Use place value concepts to represent amounts of tens and ones and to compare two digit numbers T1 - P

This indicates the sub skill taught within Unit 1 Numbers and Operations

T1 - P indicates it is Term 1 and P indicates mastery level

(P – proficient, D – developing, NI – needs improvement, SI – shows improvement)

Unit 2 Operations and Algebraic Thinking: Addition Indicates upcoming units of study.

Unit 3 Operations and Algebraic Thinking: Subtraction Indicates upcoming unit of study.

Unit 4 Operations and Algebraic Thinking Indicates upcoming unit of study.

Grades 1 and 2 are all units within each subject containing sub skills except for science and social studies. Kindergarten are all sub skills within each subject.

In 2nd grade, students have a multiplication facts raw score. This score is between 0-50. It is a raw score of multiplication fact fluency. The fluency assessment is group of 50 addition and 50 subtraction math facts. The score is a raw score of amount correct out of 50.

<u>Grades 3 - 5 Example</u>

Period 0 - Reading 4 (4 Read/1)

This indicates grade, subject and section number. The section number is simply an identification code skyward uses to attribute the student to a teacher.

Reading

This indicates subject

Grade T1 - 93 or A

T1 indicates which term it is either 1, 2, 3 or 4.

97 is numerical grade or A represents letter grade

Comprehension of Informational Text T1 - 4

This is a sub skill of reading

T1 indicates the term number

4 indicates mastery level (4 – advanced, 3 – proficient, 2 – basic, 1 – below basic)

Math, Reading and Writing all have sub skills associated with each subject. Science, Social Studies and Spelling do not have any sub skills attached to them.

Character Trait Assemblies

Students discuss the character traits of Respect, Kindness/Courtesy, Self-Discipline, Friendship, Perseverance, Diversity/Acceptance, Responsibility, Honesty and Caring at the beginning of the school year. Every month the students focus on a specific character trait. The trait is discussed at an assembly to show some examples of the trait and it's importance. Respect was the character trait for the month of October. At the end of the month each teacher is asked to give the name of one of their students who best represented that character trait during that particular month. The student chosen is recognized at an assembly, given a certificate, a t-shirt and a small gift to thank them for displaying that trait.
