Dear Counselor,

We recently shared some exciting news with you about the University of Northern Iowa Distinguished Scholar Award for Iowans. Below is information that was provided in the previous email.

Beginning the 2015-16 academic year, the award will be a four-year award instead of two-year.

- For students with an RAI score of 330 or higher, the award is now worth \$8,000. \$2,000 will be distributed each academic year (previously, this was a \$2,000 award for two years).
- For students with an RAI score of 295-329, or those with an ACT score of 28 or higher but with an RAI score lower than 295, the award is now worth \$6,000. \$1,500 will be distributed each academic year (previously, this was a \$1,000 award for two years).
- This award is not retroactive to recipients who are current UNI students.

And as a reminder, UNI's general scholarship deadline is Thursday, January 15. If you know a student who is interested in business, UNI's College of Business Administration has extended their scholarship deadline from December 15 to January 1.

This is outstanding news for future UNI students! As you continue to spread the good word about the exceptional academic, career and personal growth opportunities we offer, UNI will continue to be the university of choice for so many of your students.
