*Interviews may be conducted by reporters, talk-show hosts, or other interested people.

*Interviews usually consist of a series of questions and may appear in newspapers, magazines, TV shows or other media outlets.

Writing - What's in a Name?

- Short enough to fit on one line
- Descriptive without giving away the whole plot of the work
- Related to the text
- Capitalized properly
