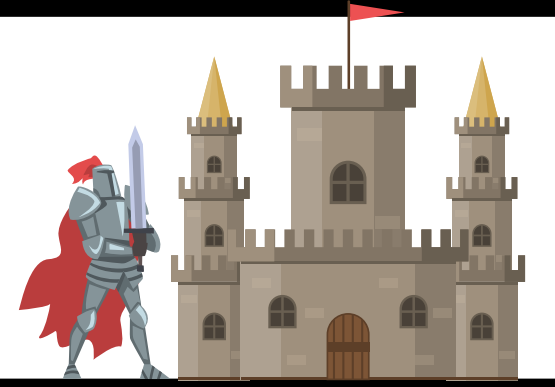

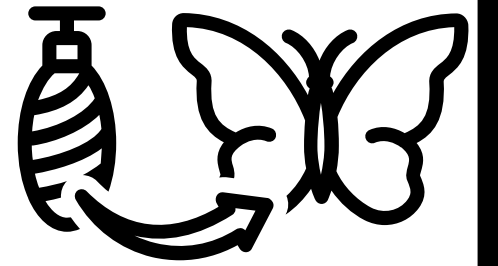
medieval

a man in the upper class who ruled over a large area of land.



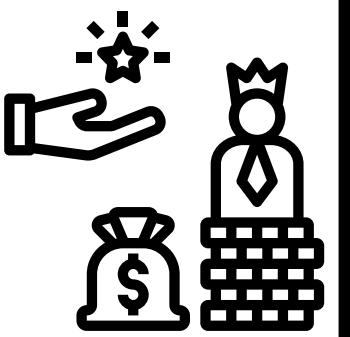
lady

a female member of the nobility



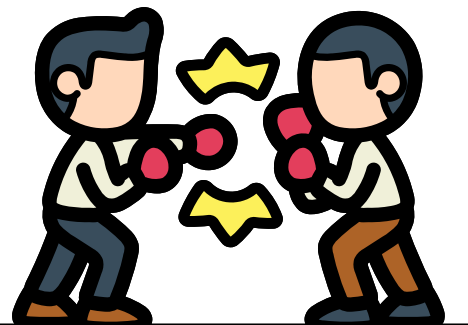
privileged

competing



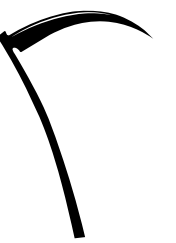
loyal

admired



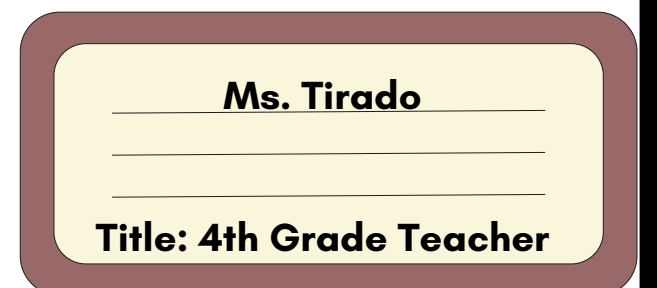
influential

hoping to be or become something



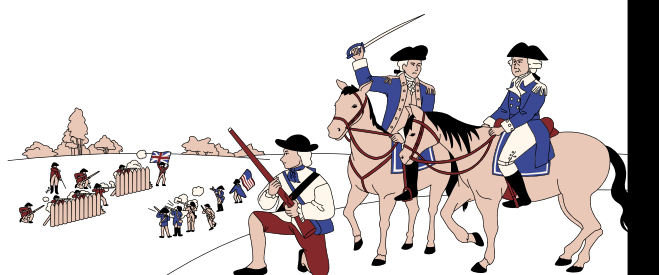
enclose
