GRAMMAR SKILLS:

*Prepositions, objects of prepositions, and prepositional phrases. Use your notes!

Preposition: a word or group of words that combines with a noun or pronoun to form a phrase that usually acts as an adverb, adjective, or noun "With" in "the house with the red door" is a **preposition**.

- Joseph is not in the box.
- CLAW is after class
- Math 7 help time is after the daily recording, but before lunch.

Objects of Prepositions: the noun or pronoun being bossed around by the preposition

- Are those Legos on the table for Nick? (objects are then table and Nick)
- Is half your day spent trying to remember the directions for the project? (object is project)
- You want me to go to LL with whom? (whom)

Prepositional phrases: add interest to your writing by becoming the adjectives/adverbs of detail.

- The cupcake with colorful sprinkles is Jozie's.
- There are lots of great students like Maddy working hard in the LL with Mss Spear.
- I gave my students fluffernutter sandwiches for reward party today.
