Essential Knowledge	 Jamestown and Plimoth Plantation were the first successful colonies established. Jamestown was established for economic reasons. The primary motivation for the settlement of Plimoth Plantation was religious freedom. King James I granted a charter to a group of London entrepreneurs to establish an English settlement in the Chesapeake Region of Virginia. The Mayflower Compact established a first set of written laws used in Plimoth Plantation. Factors the impacted the settler's daily life included: Native Americans, climate, location, water, food, clothing, shelter, colonists (status, skills, and education), etc. Jamestown's success can be attribute to factors which include: Change in leadership The cultivation and export of tobacco Jamestown's early failures can be attributed to factors which include: A primary focus on finding gold and silver Lack of attending to daily needs (food, shelter, clothing) Plimoth Plantation's success can be attributed to factors which include: Native American relationship Expanded Plymouth Colony Plimoth Plantation's early failures can be attributed to factors which include: First winter (sickness, lack of food, clothing, shelter)
