Course Description:

This is a survey course in American Government. Students will be expected to master the content knowledge and skills, and to acquire the knowledge necessary to participate effectively as citizens of the United States. The focus of the course is on the Constitution, the political process, and the role of the Supreme Court.

Textbook and Other Resources:

The course utilizes **Pearson Education's, Magruder's American Government**, 2018 edition. The text will be supplemented with material from the Internet. Until we secure the online textbook, please read the notes provided for each chapter.

Grading Policy and Scale:

The grading policy is the scale used in Accomack County: A; 95%-100%; A-; 90-94%; B+:87-89; B:83-86%; B-:80-82%; C+:77-79%; c:73-76%; C-: 70-72%; D+:67-69%; D:63-66%; D-: 60-62%; F: 0-59%. Grades will be weighted: Tests 40%; Quizzes and Projects 30%; Class Work Activities 20%; Home Work Activities 10%.

Course Calendar and Outline:

Arcadia provides each student with a planner, and it is expected that the student will maintain assignments with due dates in their planner. In addition, assignment due dates are available on the Internet through the Public Portal of Power School.

Course Activities:

Students will be graded based on assigned class work, homework, quizzes, and test. There will be a series of debate topics assigned and your child will be expected to be prepared to debate both the pro and the con of contemporary issues facing America. **Reading** from the text or other sources is assigned **nightly**. Each student is expected to complete the **daily reading assignment** and to have their **Reading Log** signed by their parent or guardian. Assigned reading is tested; therefore it is essential that it be done. In addition, each student is required to either take a weekly Current Events Quiz or to submit a weekly summary of a Current Event on the National or International level. A format for completing the Current Event will be provided. **PLEASE NOTE THAT WE ARE REQUIRED TO GIVE A ZERO, UNTIL LATE ASSIGNMENTS ARE SUBMITTED. THE FLOOR OF 50% HAS BEEN ELIMINATED.**

Course Materials:

Chromebook (school issued at no cost to students). All tests and quizzes will be done electronically. **Chromebook must be fully charged and functional.**

- If you are absent the class notes will be available electronically.
- Everyone has a right to learn so disruptive behavior is unacceptable. If you disrupt the class, you will be asked to leave.
