Parent Information

Personal Property Liability

Farmington Public School District and its staff are NOT liable for damage to or loss of personal property of students. It is suggested that items brought to school by your child and deemed by you to have substantial value be insured separately on your homeowner's policy.

Returned Check Policy

If restitution is not made on a check returned by the bank for any reason, the District will no longer accept checks from that individual. If two returned checks are received from the same individual, the District will no longer accept checks from that individual even if restitution has been made. The District's returned check fee is \$20.00.

Student Medical Insurance

We wish to emphasize that Farmington Public Schools does NOT provide any type of health or accident

insurance for injuries incurred by your child at school. Since children are particularly susceptible to injuries, we encourage you to review your present health and accident insurance program to determine if your coverage is adequate.

If you do not feel your insurance is adequate because of a deductible or co-insurance clause or if you do not have insurance, we encourage you to review the voluntary student insurance program offered by Student Assurance Services. This plan will provide benefits for medical expenses incurred because of an accident. An explanation of the cost and benefits is explained on their website (www.sas-mn.com). East Middle School welcomes a visit from **New York Times Editor Tracy Bennett**

On October 11, 2023, East Middle School (EMS) had a visit from Tracy Bennett, a New York Times editor. Tracy is an editor with the very popular daily game, Wordle.

Tracy visited EMS after she found that the Newcomer students in Susan Bertoni's class play Wordle every day. Wordle helps the stu-

dents with their language skills and vocabulary, as many of the students are new to the country.

The game grew in popularity very quickly, becoming a household staple. Families, classrooms, and friends come together to play the game every day. In

Wordle is a word game that was created by

November of 2020, only 90 people were playing the game. In January of 2021, the number grew to 300,000 playing the game. Now, millions of

people play across the country.

While visiting East, Tracy talked about her experience with the game during her presentation. Tracy had al-

ways loved playing and creating her own cross word puzzles. She published her very own puzzles in 2013 and it became her full time job in 2020. She did this until she became a Wordle editor in 2022. Tracy talked about editing Wordle including, randomly choosing words, editing lists, avoiding similar words, variations in difficulty, and more.

During her presentation, students had the opportunity to help choose Wordle words for

November, and were able to play Wordle with Tracy. This was such an amazing experience for the students.

Architect Steven Schneemann assists Farmington STEAM Academy fifth graders with an architectural project thanks to Bosch Corporation Grant

Last spring, Steven Schneemann, local architect and business owner of S3 Architecture, gave a presentation to support a fifth grade multidisciplinary project at Farmington STEAM Academy (FSA). Now, he is back and ready to consult with the new fifth graders, some of whom will be finishing an authentic construction design project that was begun by last year's students.

The project got started when students were challenged with the design question: How can we design a solution to solve the problem of inadequate space for the birds and students? Schneemann, partnered with Jeffrey Rehbine, fifth grade teacher at FSA, and his fifth grade students to finish working drawings of student designs and models in order for students to complete an expansion of the chicken coop run

in the school courtyard. Rehbine and Schneemann talked with students about what architects do and challenged students to consider it as a career direction.

Students designed and built scaled architectural models over the winter in preparation for building an addition to the FSA chicken coop. Schneemann volunteered to offer advice on the design.

"Steven has partnered with us as our senior design consultant to complete professional drawings from which students can use to build the structure," said Jeffrey Rehbine. "This way students get a real-world first-hand account of the process in a way that is authentic and inside of their own life experience."

FSA teachers Jeffrey Rehbine and Steven Trachsel designed the Project-Based Learning (PBL) challenge that combines math, design, building skills, writing, ecology, and virtual drawing in the form of a design challenge for fifth graders. They were awarded a \$2,000 grant from BOSCH Corporation for the project materials.

Students worked with teachers to measure and assess the needs of the chickens and site require-

ments to begin their designs. They worked on a computer design app called Tinker CAD to create 3D models to begin. Next, students transferred their models into 2D templates on Google Draw to create scaled models of their additional designs.

Students presented some models to Mr. Schneemann last spring, including the winning model, which S3 Architecture will base the drawings on. The new fifth grade students that started in August 2023 will be learning about the project from some of their predecessors

who will come back as sixth grade consultants to explain their work. Later, the new fifth graders will finish building the addition from S3 Architecture's plans with some help from the sixth grade designers, too.

Schneemann will consult with the fifth graders about their original design before they submit the final drawings. Students are being organized into task teams that take care of the courtyard, chickens, and rabbits each year, along with touring them to all of the classrooms. Among these teams is a craftsman team and an artisan team that will work on the final construction.

Jeffrey Rehbine would love to see the benefits of this project-based partnered learning happen more often, "Today's students need exposure to multiple types of real-world skills and opportunities in order to make intelligent choices about their own interests, passions, and careers. I'm grateful that we have the kind of school and community that can provide that for them."



Farmington Public Schools' accepting Schools of Choice applications January 29-February 16, 2024



Applications will be open for grades Kindergarten through 9th grade. Applications for Farmington Online, our remote and virtual programs, will be open for Kindergarten through eighth grade.

Online applications will be available beginning Monday, January 29, 2024, on the Farmington Public Schools' website, www.farmington.k12.mi.us.

Applications for Section 105 Schools of Choice for the 2024-2025 school year must be submitted by 11:59 PM on Friday, February 16, 2024. No applications will be honored after the February 16th deadline.

In order to support the District's goal of excellence and equity for all students, the granting of choice is balanced with the need to provide an equitable and appropriate enrollment in all of our schools. Final placement will be determined based on current enrollment, projected enrollment, 2024-2025 staffing levels/ratios, and the number of applications received for each school/level.
