# Goals

- Create shorter documents that align with the updated New Jersey Student Learning Standards and skills.
- Provide clear and concise information on student progress to parents.
- Ensure consistency between grade levels in language and grading whenever possible.
- Review the grading scales and number of performance levels (ie. three levels versus four).
- Review grading in trimesters instead of quarterly marking periods.

#### Trimesters

- Reporting periods will change from quarterly (4) marking periods to trimester (3) marking periods.
- Provides more consecutive time for teachers to challenge and support students' academic, social, and emotional growth.
- Allows for more information, data, and grades, assisting teachers with a more accurate representation of student progress.
- Provides more time for student growth to be evident.

### **Parent-Teacher Conferences**

- 1st-6th Grades: Scheduled for early November with time before the end of the first trimester
- 5th-6th Grades: Scheduled as needed
- Kindergarten: Moved from January to early December and will coincide with the end of the first trimester

- No overall grades in each subject area
- Grading in standards (1-4), all subject areas
  - 4 The student consistently exceeds expectations.
  - 3 The student successfully meets expectations.
  - 2 The student is progressing towards expectations.
  - 1 The student needs support in order to meet expectations.
- Grading of Social and Work Skills (plus, minus, slash)
  - + Area of Strength
  - / Meets grade level expectations
  - - Area of Need
- Use of a rubric as a guide



# Grading and Reporting 4-6

- Overall grades in each subject area (A-F), with a plus (+) denoting the upper range
- Grading in standards (1-4), all subject areas
  - 4 The student consistently exceeds expectations.
  - 3 The student successfully meets expectations.
  - 2 The student is progressing towards expectations.
  - 1 The students needs support in order to meet expectations.
- No grading of Social and Work skills in 5th and 6th grades.
