Welcome to Visions Unlimited!

Visions Unlimited is an Adult Transition program operated by Farmington Public Schools. Visions serves adults ages 18 – 26 who have physical and/or developmental disabilities and students on the autism spectrum.

Students are assigned to Visions Unlimited through the Special Education Individualized Educational Planning Team (IEPT) process and are residents of Farmington or Farmington Hills.

The Visions staff is dedicated to ensuring that each student reaches their potential as a contributing citizen, productive worker, and community participant. Each student has individual goals for improving independent living and employability skills. These goals are achieved through classroom and community based instruction.



Programs

Visions students participate in a variety of programs including Bountiful Backpacks (provides food to students in Title 1 schools), PEAC (Programs to Educate All Cyclists), Smart Bus training, and Book Clubs with the Farmington Public Library. These programs offer exposure to community outreach and teach strategies for independent living.

✔ Data Limit:

Community Based Instruction (CBI)

Visions students participate in everyday living activities in the community such as shopping, going to the bank, post office, movie theaters, or restaurants. They practice their communication skills, social skills, safety, financial budgeting, and advocacy skills all while supervised in the local community.

Enrichment Classes

Daily enrichment classes are part of the Visions Unlimited curriculum. These classes focus on leisure activities and physical fitness. Current enrichment classes include:

PAES/Microenterprise

PAES (Practical Assessment Exploration System) is a hands-on program that allows students to practice universal work skills. Students learn entry-level skills in multiple career/work areas, follow work procedures, learn appropriate work behaviors, and learn problem solving skills. The Microenterprise course provides students with work-related experiences. They learn how to follow multi-step directions, track finances, problem solve, and more while selling products they make.
