**Course Description:** The content of the course will be based on the information required to understand the course of US history until 1865 and the skills required under the Core Curriculum Content Standards for Social Studies.

### **Course Objectives:**

- 1. Distinguish valid arguments from false arguments when interpreting current and historical events
- 2. Take a position on a current public policy issue and support it with historical evidence, reasoning, and constitutional analysis in a written and/or oral format
- 3. Compare present and past events to evaluate the consequences of past decisions and to apply lessons learned
- 4. Analyze how change occurs through time due to shifting values and beliefs as well as technological advancements and changes in the political and economic landscape
- 5. Construct various forms of geographic representations to show the spatial patterns of physical and human phenomena
- 6. Relate current events to the physical and human characteristics of places and regions
- 7. Evaluate sources for validity and credibility and to detect propaganda, censorship, and bias

#### **Required Supplies:**

**Note:** It is mandatory that each student have their binder every day in class.

**Note:** Parents/Guardians and administrators will have the right to look at the students' notebook (binder) at any time. Therefore, students must always place their work in their notebook the day the work is given back to them.

Each student's notebook (binder) will be checked and graded at least once every six weeks.

**Grading Policy:** Each six weeks, grades will be based on test performance, including document based questions, class presentations, completion of assignments, class participation, and group activities.

Tests/Quizzes- 30% Authentic Assessment- 25% Class Participation- 15% Homework- 15% Class work- 15% Students may earn extra credit for additional individual projects – but only if they have turned in all assigned work. The highest grade you can make on late work is 70. All late work must be completed within one week from the due date.

Grades are available for review at any time before or after school. The midterm and final examination account for 20% of the overall grade.

**Homework:** Homework will be assigned regularly in this course. Homework is a way to practice concepts covered in class. Practice is essential for mastery and success. Without practice, without doing your homework, you will not pass. Unless otherwise instructed, homework assigned during the week will be due at the beginning of next class. Late homework will be accepted but the highest grade possible for complete assignments will be a 70. It is your responsibility to turn in your homework on time. Homework done timely will help you assess your understanding and need for support.

**Projects:** There will be assigned one to two small individual and/or group US History I project(s) every six weeks. Each project will be assigned toward the first part of the six weeks.

**Tests**: You should expect 2 tests and a 6-week's test in each 6-week grading period. These tests will cover the concepts covered during class. To be successful, you should complete all assigned homework, participate in class, as well as review these topics prior to the exams. It is my expectation that this minimum degree of preparation will be done by all students.

**Make-up Policy:** Students who are absent are responsible for the work and instruction missed. IF you are absent on a due date and have an "excused absence" card, all work is due by the second day you return; deadline for assignments given on the day you were absent will be discussed. Students must be present on the day of a major test.

#### **Classroom Rules of Conduct:**

- 1. Be prepared for class in the following ways:
- a. Bring your material to class everyday: pen/pencil, college ruled notebook paper, and/or binder.
- b. Be on time and be prepared to begin as soon as the bell rings.
