

VISUAL ARTS Audition Requirements

- All students applying for admission to Arts High School as Visual Art Majors must audition.
- Students can sign up for an audition on the Arts High School website.

Visual Art Audition Requirements are:

1. ART ENTRANCE EXAM

- Applicants should come prepared with 2-3 sharpened number 2 pencils
- Actual seat time for exam will be 70-90 minutes.

THE ART ENTRANCE EXAM WILL INCLUDE:

- A Realistic STILL-LIFE DRAWING From Observation (25 minutes)
 - Good composition
 - Understanding of spatial relationships
 - o Interpretation of form, value, and texture
- A QUICK-FIGURE DRAWING from observation (10 minutes)
 - Good composition
 - Scale and Proportion
 - o Interpretation of form
- A SELF-PORTRAIT while looking in a mirror (15 minutes)
 - Good composition
 - Scale and Proportion
 - o Interpretation of form, value and texture
- A SPATIAL RELATIONSHIP EXERCISE (10 minutes)

2. PORTFOLIO REVIEW

- While not required, a portfolio is strongly recommended.
- Your portfolio should include a minimum of 5-7 pieces of your strongest artwork.
- Portfolios will be assessed as you work on the entrance exam.

PRACTICING FOR THE ART ENTRANCE EXAM

- The best way to prepare for the exam is to practice drawing from observation (looking at what you are drawing).
 - Still Life-You can arrange several objects clustered together on a table top and draw them as they appear. You should make the objects look three-dimensional on the page and add value and texture as you see them.
 - **Figure Drawing**-Get someone to model for you and practice drawing the full figure in a variety of poses.
 - **Self-Portrait**-Practice drawing your face from life while looking in a mirror, not a photograph.
- You might want to practice new drawings every week, or a little every night. Remember the more you practice drawing the better you get.
- Ask the Art Teacher at your current school to help by teaching you to draw what you see and instruct you how to create a good composition using space, form, value and texture.

THE PORTFOLIO

Two-Dimensional Work (drawings, paintings, etc.)

- Bring original work.
- Bring drawings done from observation, rather than on photos or other artwork.

Three-Dimensional Work (sculptures, mobiles, etc.)

- Small sculptures can be brought to the audition.
- If sculpture is large or bulky, a photograph of it, taken against a contrasting background, is acceptable.

Time-based and Digital Work (photographs, animations, movies)

- Photos should be printed out and presented in the portfolio with other work. These should <u>not</u> be in a digital file.
- If you would like us to view animation or video, please provide a flash drive with written instructions on how to access the file. These will be viewed on a school computer; there is no need to bring your own laptop.
- You may also include examples of other media that demonstrate the diversity of your talent. We discourage portfolios consisting solely of cartoons and superhero images.
- There is no need to purchase an expensive portfolio. A simple hand-made cardboard portfolio is adequate.

• On the outside of your portfolio, please place a label clearly lettered with your name, age, and current grade.

TIPS:

- Do not matte works. Our focus is the quality of the work, not the mattes.
- Please DO NOT bring work in frames.
- When you have completed your audition, remember to take your portfolio home. We do not want your work lost or damaged.
