

The Honorable Mention award places them in the top 10% of all Exploravision projects submitted to the competition this year. Only 5 teams from Ohio were on the Honorable Mention list. They are certainly commended for a job well done in

demonstrating innovative thinking in their exploration of science and its impact on technology and the future. Each student received a certificate and a 3D Hologram Device.

# What is ExploraVision?

ExploraVision is a science competition that goes beyond the typical student science competition and into what it takes to bring ideas to reality. A teacher will sponsor and lead his/her students as they work in groups of 2 – 4 to simulate real research and development. A teacher will guide his or her students as they pick a current technology, research it, envision what it might look like in 20 years, and describe the development steps, pros & cons, and obstacles. Past winners have envisioned technologies ranging from a hand-held food allergen detector to a new device to help people who have lost limbs regain movement in real time.

# Who can participate?

ExploraVision is designed for K-12 students of all interest, skill and ability levels. The competition is open to students enrolled in public, private or home school in the United States and Canada.

# **Mumps Outbreak Highlights Need to Stay Current on Immunizations**

COLUMBUS, OH —As the Ohio Department of Health (ODH) continues to investigate a growing number of mumps cases in the Central Ohio, the agency reminds Ohioans that vaccinations are the most effective way to prevent illness from vaccine-preventable diseases, including mumps. Mumps is a contagious disease that is spread person to person through the saliva or mucus from the mouth, nose, or throat of an infected person, usually when that person coughs, sneezes, or talks.

Given this outbreak, to ensure that you and those around you are protected from mumps, ODH encourages individuals who are considered at high risk of mumps – those who have not received any doses of measles-mumps-rubella (MMR) and those who have received only one dose of MMR – to get vaccinated.

"Immunization is the most effective way to protect yourself and your family from vaccine-preventable diseases," said ODH State Epidemiologist Dr. Mary DiOrio. "In addition, to reduce the spread of infectious diseases, such as mumps, wash your hands often, cover your cough, and stay home when you are ill."

ODH supports the vaccine recommendations set forth by the Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices (ACIP) and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). These recommendations include vaccination schedules for when individuals (children and adults) should receive their vaccinations. Ohioans are encouraged to consult with their health care provider if they have questions regarding their immunization status.


