

Winter Weather Reminders - As the weather continues to change and the cold weather continues to get colder, we have a few reminders for student safety at Van Buren All students go outside each day for recess. Winter clothing is necessary every day. This should include a warm winter coat, hat, and gloves or mittens. Students in K - 5 must have snow pants and boots on in order to go into the snow. Otherwise they will be required to stay on the blacktop. If it is raining or snowing heavily in the morning when students come to school they are to go to the doors they usually line up at, not the front doors. There are staff members and safety patrol members to let them in and direct them to the location they should be at until the bell rings at 8:15. Remember: no student should be on campus until 8:05 a.m. (excludes bus students).

Temperature For Indoor Recess - All Janesville School District schools will be consistent about the temperature for indoor recess. The temperature will be "feels like" 0 degrees Fahrenheit. Precipitation, icy conditions on the playground or other unsafe weather situations will continue to be reasons to have indoor recess if the temperature is higher than 0 degrees.

Attendance - Regular school attendance is so very important. It is only through regular attendance that students are able to take full advantage of their learning opportunities. The responsibility for elementary school attendance rests upon the student and the parent/guardian.

Under state law a parent/guardian may only excuse their child's absence from school for 10 days during a school year. This includes absences related to excuses for part of a school day. Absences related to student medical needs, funeral, or an out of school suspension are not counted against the parent/guardian excused absences. However, please schedule routine appointments outside the school day as much as possible.

Please make sure your child is here on time every day ready to learn. Establishing a consistent morning routine which includes getting to school on time when your child is young will help him/her for an entire school career and beyond.

Infinite Campus Updates - Please keep the

school office in-

formed of changes of address, phone numbers, and emergency information that occur during the school year. It is extremely important that we are able to contact parents in the event of illness or other emergencies. All families should be sure to update information directly through the Infinite Campus Parent Portal system as it changes. If you do make a change, please notify the school to inform them that a change was made. If you do not have computer access, please contact the school to assist. Please check your information periodically. The following can be updated on line through Infinite Campus:

Household Information – addresses and phone numbers, as well as preferences on how you prefer to be contacted (Phone Call, Text Message, or E-mail).

You may send requests for address changes online, but as in the past, you will need to provide proof of residency to the school office (during the school year), or come to the New Student Enrollment Office at the Educational Services Center (during the summer when school is not in session). It is a requirement that you prove who you are and where you live. Please provide a driver's license/picture ID, Proof of Residency (One of the following: Address change form that the US Post Office sends to your new address, current bill with address and date, or a lease agreement with date and address on it. Closing paperwork from purchase of new home with address and purchase date.) The proof of residency must be linked to your new address with the past month. It is always important to update your address as soon as possible.

Public School Open Enrollment Timelines

The State of Wisconsin has announced the application period for open enrollment (also known as public school choice) begins in February for the following school year. Open Enrollment laws permit children to attend a public school in a school district other than the one in which they live. The open enrollment application period for the 2018-2019 school year is from February 5, 2018 - April 30, 2018. Parents are encouraged to apply on-line athttps://dpi.wi.gov/open-enrollment. Although on-line application is recommended, paper applications may be obtained from the Department of Public Instruction or any school district after January 15, 2018 and must be delivered (hand-delivery is recommended) to the nonresident school district during the application period. Paper applications to attend Janesville must be submitted to the Administrative Services Department no later than 4:00 p.m. on April 30th (a postmark does not constitute timely submission). Applications turned in prior to February 5th will be returned as not valid and must be resubmitted after February 5th but before April 30th. Enrollment in a requested school or program is subject to space and other limitations and is not guaranteed. Transportation is the responsibility of the parent. Under School District of Janesville board policy, students who attended the district under open enrollment the previous year are not required to reapply for the following school year. An application is required for each sibling in the family. For example, if a family has one child in elementary school that has been approved for open enrollment and a new student entering kindergarten next year, the student entering kindergarten must apply for open enrollment in order to attend the School District of Janesville. Parents will be informed in June whether their open enrollment applications have been approved or denied. The student's school or program placement will be provided in June. If you have questions, please contact the Administrative Services Office at 743-5006.



Moving in P.E.


K-Kids Sharing Kindness!

TOO SICK FOR SCHOOL

One of the problems most often confronting parents of school-age children occurs when a child complains of not feeling well on a school day. A decision must be made as to whether the child stays home or goes to school. How do you make the right decision? The fol-

lowing information are guidelines to assist you in making the decision as to when your child should stay home from school.

Fever of 100 degrees or above. A student needs to be <u>fever-free for 12 hours with-out medication before returning</u>.

Rash or "spots" may cover the entire body or may appear in just one area. Before a student returns to school a doctor needs to say it is safe to do so. Notify the school immediately if the child developed an illness or disease that could be contagious.

Diarrhea, vomiting, stomachache (ache persistent and severe enough to limit activity, call a doctor) are all situations where students need to be kept home until they are able to digest food properly. Students may return to school if they have had a <u>12 hour period without vomiting.</u>

Cold, cough, and sore throat are all situations where students need to be kept home if it would limit your students ability to function efficiently. If white spots can be seen in the back of the throat or a fever is present, contact a doctor.

Conjunctivitis or Pink Eye is uncomfortable and very contagious. A student may have a whitish discharge and complain of burning or itching. Pink eye usually requires prescription eye drops. Students should not return to school until they have used the drops for 24 hours.

Pain – Toothaches go to the dentist, earaches call doctor without delay, headaches student may go to school if it is the only complaint.

When students are at school they are asked to participate in all activities including outdoor events, recess, gym etc. unless the student has written doctor's excuse.
