Directions: Go to the above website for the answers to the following questions! You can also just search “Metkids.”

EXPLORE THE MAP (click on “explore the map” in the top left)

You will see red and yellow dots on many things. Click on the dots to explore.

1. Move around the map. You cannot see the whole map on your screen so make sure you can move around it (scroll to the side and up)
2. Click on one **red dot**. What is the **name** of the first thing you clicked on?

3. What was the “**fun fact**” about your first exhibit?

4. Can you find the **Tomb of Perneb**? When was it created?

5. Find the **Temple of Dendur** (hint - scroll right). Click “watch” to watch the short video about how things are brought into the museum. How did they get the Temple of Dendur into place?

6. Can you find one more thing that was created over 2000 years ago in the BC era? What is it you found?

7. Scroll up to the paintings (they are closer to the top of the map). Find **one painting** you REALLY like!

8. Find an OIL painting (you will need to click on each painting and look at “what it is made of”). What is the name of the painting?

9. Find **Study of a Young Woman** (painting). In what country was this painted?

10. Find **View of Toledo** (painting - top/right). Click on “Discover.”

11. Pick one of the exhibits to recreate below as a **sketch**. It can be however you want it to look!

14. Find **Stepping Out** by Roy Lichtenstein (top left of map). The fun fact talks about how people debate if he is a good artist. What do you think? Do you like this piece? Why or why not?

15. Scroll down the map on the left hand side. Find one statue. What year was it made? Out of what material?

16. Click on a textile (like carpets!) in the Antonio Ratti Textile Center (in the middle of the map). When you find a textile, click on “imagine.” Write the textile’s name you chose and answer the “imagine” question below.

17. Click on 2 yellow dots. What did you discover?
