1. _____: the visual quality of objects caused by the amount of light they reflect or absorb.
2. _____: another word for color.
3. _____: the lightness or darkness of a color.
4. _____: a light value of a color.
5. _____: a dark value of a color.
6. _____: the brightness or dullness of a color.
7. _____: a color that cannot be mixed from other colors.
8. _____: a color made by mixing two primary colors.
9. _____: a color that is a mixture of a primary and secondary color that are next to each other on the color wheel.
10. _____: the plan for combining colors in a work of art.
11. _____: colors that contrast with one another. These colors are opposite one another on the color wheel.
12. _____: the family of colors that includes reds, oranges, and yellows.
13. _____: the family of colors that includes greens, blues, and violets.
14. _____: a color scheme that uses different values of a single hue.
15. _____: colors that appear next to each other on the color wheel. These colors have one hue in common.
16. _____: a word used for black, white, and tints and shades of gray. Tints and shades of brown can also be used.
