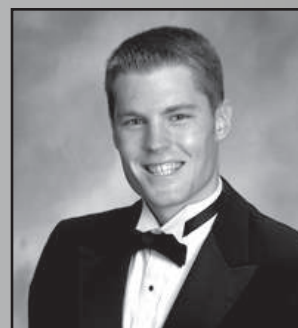

The Green Pepper



The Green Pepper is a Hibachi Japanese steakhouse restaurant. The prices of their food range from \$9 to \$26. Customers sit around a table that features a stove in the middle.

While talking with friends and waiting, the chef prepares the food in front of the guests. Customers will need to make reservations in advance because tables fill up. The Hibachi lunch is served with salad, soup, vegetables, and steamed rice. When customers are seated, they are served hot towels to wipe their hands. When customers are ready to order, the waiter takes orders and while customers wait for the hibachi chef to come out, the waiter serves vegetable soup for an appetizer. After

the soup, guests are served a small bowl of salad with house dressing. When the chef is ready, they come out with a cart of the food, unprepared, that the patrons ordered. The chef starts by cooking rice. The chef pours a big bowl of rice on the stove in front of the guests and starts breaking eggs and cutting small pieces of chicken to put in the rice. While he is cooking, the chef makes small jokes about the food. When he breaks the eggs, he throws them up in the air,

catches them with his spatula, and throws them up again and then breaks them on the stove. After he is done cooking, he serves the food on each plate and cleans up the stove while the customers begin eating.

"The Green Pepper was very exciting because the sword man lit his hand on fire and asked me to shake his hand. The atmosphere was very stimulating. And everybody was happy, and the calamari I ate was delicious. Some would say it was very uniquely tasty," student Arielle Martin said.

The staff at The Green Pepper is friendly with customers and includes them in the show.

"It was cool because he gave us nicknames and I was called Pokemon," Student Andy Zuniga said. "The food tasted good because it had many flavors because of the way they cooked it."

For people looking for a good time with friends and family but not wanting to spend too much

money, The Green Pepper is a good choice.

"It was a good time to get together and bond with friends," Student Samantha Jones said. "It was also fun cause our waiter was really awesome."

The Green Pepper is located at 4843 Colleyville Blvd #330 in Colleyville. Lunch is from 11 a.m. to 2 p.m. Tuesday through Friday. On Saturday, it is from 12 p.m. to 2:30 p.m. Dinner times are: Sunday and Tuesday through Thursday, 5 p.m. to 9 p.m., and Friday and Saturday 5 p.m. to 10 p.m. They are closed all day Monday and during lunch on Sundays.

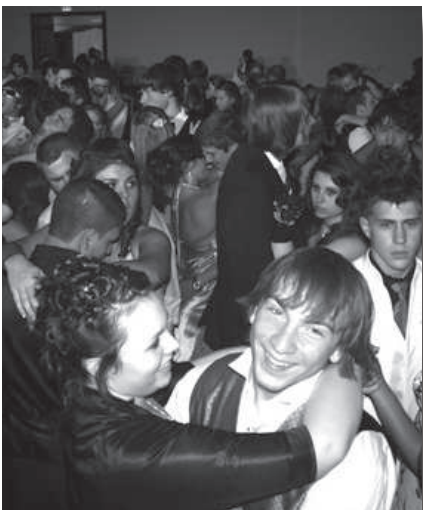

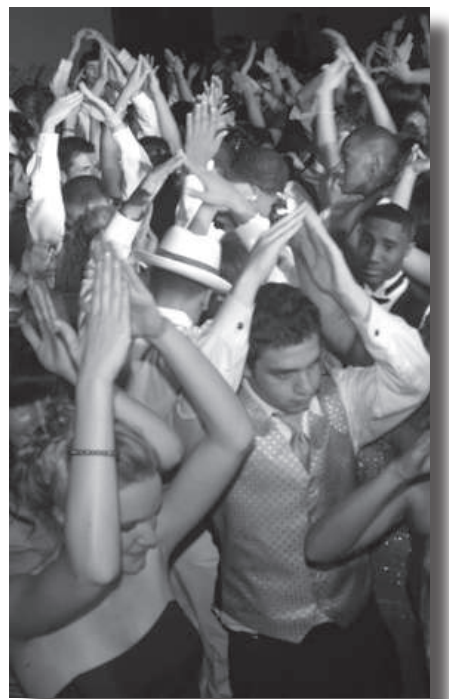

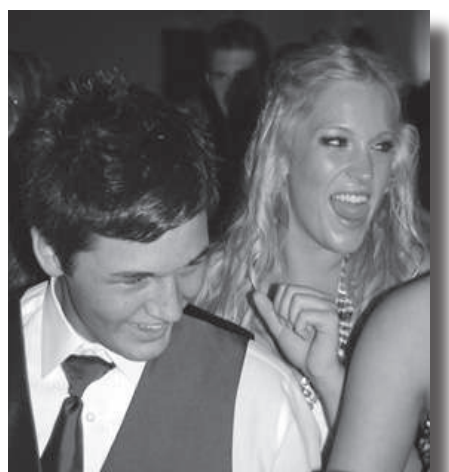
