Passing Key # 1:

Wrist and

Hands

Together



Press your wrists and forearm together to form your platform.



Passing Key #2:

Straight and Simple

Simple is repeatable. When we do something simple, we can repeat it over and over again.






Day 1: Toss, Pass, Catch





We do groups of 3 with toss, pass, catch. It will work better when we move onto triangle passing. The third person waits behind the passer. Rotate everyone through every 5 passes.

The target should be at the net since we should always pass towards the net.



Passing Key #3:

The Ball Knows Angles

A ball doesn't have a brain so it will only go where you tell it to.



I drop my shoulder and tilt my platform to direct where I want my pass to go.

Day 1: Triangle Passing






Triangle Passing- Passer faces the friend to their left who holds the ball. They angle their arms to pass the ball to their friend on the right. (Counter Clockwise)

Start off with toss, pass, and catch.

Day 1: Triangle Passing





Triangle Passing- always go to the right.

If you have toss-pass-catch down, keep it going.

If this is too hard, go back to toss, pass catch.

Day 1: Nuke'Em



Nuke'em is a throw and catch game. Throw it short, deep, corners, I will usually do 3 teams which will have 9-10 players on a team who throw and catch. Off team takes the place of the losing team.

Scoring- Several ways

- 1. One team eliminates all their opponents. (Takes a while so don't do it a lot.)
- 2. Whoever scores 5 points first wins.
- 3. Scoring points AND whoever messes up and drops the ball is eliminated from the game.

Keep It Up




Keep It Up isn't really volleyball game, but it's a lot of fun! Blow up your Omnikin balls, divide your group in half and let them go to town!






Right Handed Serve



Wall Smooshes with a partner. Then partner serve across the net. Start close. If you can get it over, move back a couple of steps.








If kids are having trouble getting an overhead serve over, I will also introduce a sidearm i.e. a torque serve. Robbie has done this serve for 2 seasons because he has had to play with a heavier volleyball and the torque serve helped him get his serve over.



Torque serve is similar to the twisting motion of throwing a ball with facing sideways to the target and stepping with opposite foot.






The opposite of dead fish is "The Serving Game." All kids sit. One server serves. Kid touches it in the air, they join the server and continue serving. Game is over when everyone is serving.

Serving Game: Dead Fish-

Servers line up on end line in two lines that meet in the middle of the court. Each kid at the front of the line serves the ball over the net either overhead or underhand. Try to serve from behind the black line, but scoot up if you are having trouble. If you make it, shag your ball and get at end of line. If you miss, go lay down on the floor on the other side of the net like a dead fish. If you can catch a served ball coming over the net, you can get back in line. The team to have more kids still in the game at the end of time limit, wins.


Clap the rhythm-1-2-34 (last two are fast as you can see with Brit and Jordan's footwork)






Have kids line up on your "10-foot lines." Use cones as boundaries if needed. I use spray-painted numbers that the kids sit on as starting points. Walk them through the footwork. Group left-handed kids together since their footwork differs from right-handed kids.

Remind kids to jump up, not forward, to avoid going under the net and stepping on others' feet.

If someone keeps going under, they sit out until they control their body.







Fluffball Throw

each have their own fluff ball. Kids attempt and approach and throw it over. Fluff balls don't fly far so easy to retrieve and get back in line. С

There are 12 rows in my gym so the kids line up with their row and




You Go, I Throw

Kids take their first 2 steps, then give them a short toss and let them swing.

I combine the rows and let the kids "tryout" to be a tosser. I will position myself as an "E" tosser so I can toss and monitor other groups too.

Lefties should let their tosser know who they are.

Shag the ball, give it to the kids at the front of the line.






Day 4: Toss, Set, Catch

Day 4: Setting to a hitter

Key 3: Face the ball, Superman to your target.

Jordan faces the ball which is held by Britni, he then Superman follow throughs to his target which would be an outside hitter.

We may not be able to do this during PE, but this is to show kids what an outside set looks like.




Day 5: Serve Receive

What is serve receive?

Serve Receive is one of the hardest skills to learn. Why?

The best way to know if the ball is yours is if it deep and on your left or short and on your right. We call these passing lanes.





#13- Nathanial- serve receive on the left side of the court. The ball was short and on his right side, so he stepped in front of Alex (in the white uniform) and took it. Note: Nate was a front row hitter even though he was passing. So after he passed the ball, what did he do next?

How did the play end?

Day 5: Serve Receive

Serve Receive-ish- A serve receive ball is coming at you over the net. So let's simulate that.

<u>"Server"</u> (Gage is in the black shirt.) The server can hit, toss, or throw over the net at a passer. If you try to hit it over and you don't have the control, toss or throw.

<u>Passer</u> (Jax is in the white shirt.) Passer attempts to pass the ball to the target.

<u>Target</u> (Declan is in the blue shirt.) The target at the net catches the ball. (In a real volleyball match, what would the target actually be doing?)

Day 6: Game Play & Rules

See if you can follow along! An ace is when a serve is so tough that it hits the ground of the passer shanks for ball off.

The goal is always to get three touches. We want a pass, set, hit, but sometimes it doesn't happen!

We will get 12 kids on the court and walk through some scenarios.


- 1. If the ball touches the line, it is _____

Days 7, 8, and 9: Tournament Play

Kids in 4th and 5th grade who want to play can sign up. Coach Hancock will put you on teams. You will come up with a captain, team name, and lineup.

Those who do not want to play will go with Coach Hertel and do other activities. If there are more than 3 teams, Coach Hancock will set up both nets and bring a guest referee in so 2 matches can happen at a time.

Day 6: Game Play and Rules

We play the best out of 3 games to 15 points. Win by 2 points.

If a server serves 3 points in a row, they will roll the ball under and give it to the other team. This is to prevent a good server from serving for an entire set because we want to play volleyball.

Be an encouraging teammate. If someone messes up, they know it, they don't need you to tell them that.
