

Project Documentation: Along your journey with this new artwork, take pictures of your progress and tell me about what you are doing, mistakes, how you are overcoming them and creating your vision.	
<b>REFLECTION</b> : What do you like about your work? What do you dislike?	
<b>ARTIST STATEMENT</b> : Complete an artist statement that will accompany your project so that others will understand your work.	Art statement link
