Kindergarten

<u>Field trip</u>: We will be taking a field trip to Busy Barn Farm in Fort Atkinson on Oct. 19th. Please return your slip and pay ASAP. You may pay online on Infinite Campus or use the envelope sent home. In order to volunteer you must submit a volunteer application (including reference) and be approved at the downtown office.

<u>Assessments</u>: We have been working very hard on initial assessments. We are now starting our regular curriculum. Please support your child by reading, counting, and practicing letters and sounds at home.

<u>Behaviors</u>: We have also been working hard on learning rules and acceptable behaviors. Remember green is very good.

<u>Folders</u>: Please check your child's folder nightly and remove all papers, except the communication log. Please return the communication log daily, as well as on Mondays. We use them as a record for behaviors. Please be sure your child brings his/her folder to school daily.

<u>Name Writing</u>: Please help your child practice name writing by using a capital (upper case) letter for the first letter, then lower case for the rest.

<u>Jolly Phonics</u>: Please save the phonics pages as they come home and continue to practice letters, sounds, and motions.

Grade 1

First grade is off to a great start! Thank you for the wonderful letters you sent to us allowing us to get to know your child better. The students are continuing to adjust to the first grade schedule and expectations. Your children have been learning about having a growth mindset and the power of YET. You might hear them talking about some of our quotes we use daily to remind them to stay positive about their learning process. In Science we will be learning about living and nonliving things, as well as plant and animal parts. Be looking for Math homework sheets that come home with each daily lesson. Find some time each week to have your child read to you.



Welcome back returning and new families to Washington School. We are so excited to get to know your child. It was great to see such an awesome turnout at our back to school night and your children certainly enjoy using all of their new supplies! During the first few weeks of school second graders were introduced to and practiced second grade routines.

During the first trimester second graders will be learning about their community, citizenship, and diversity in social studies. In science, the children will be learning about plants and habitats. Math topics will include addition and subtraction through 18 (practice those facts nightly), number patterns, as well as double digitaddition (Did we mention practice those math facts? ③).

Students are encouraged to read at least 20 minutes nightly to build their fluency and comprehension. Encourage your child to return his/her library books weekly and to check out books they can read independently.

Grade 3

In third grade we have been very busy. We have loved getting to know your child and have been learning our rules and routines. In third grade we begin to focus on multiplication so it is very important that every student knows their addition and subtraction facts. Please continue to practice these at home. In science we are learning about plant and animal life cycles. We will be diving deeper into the life cycle of a pumpkin with our field trip to the Rotary Gardens on October 10th . We look forward to seeing you all at conferences at the end of the month so we can tell you more about all the wonderful things your child is doing.

Grade 4

Fall is here and we are busy learning all the routines, rules and schedules. We have also been working on Math facts, Reading stamina, Life Science and Maps. Please keep reading and practicing math (multiplication) facts at home. Our first reading series of Journeys focuses on the community and helping each other out. Our PBIS theme of "Everyday Heroes" focuses on this as well.

As the seasons changed we had the wonderful experience of a field trip to our very own Janesville Outdoor Lab (JSOL). This experience will tie into our first Science unit and later Social Studies units. Please have your child dress in layers because we are sometimes colder in the classroom than outside, and sometimes vice versa. We look forward to seeing you all at conferences in October. We have had a busy start to the year! We spent a few days remembering expectations and practicing how to be great role models for the other students here at Washington. We have a mission to lead by example since we are the oldest students in the building! We have finished our first round of STAR testing in reading/math, and look forward to showing what we know and growing in our abilities. We've been working hard on place value in Math, to the 10ths, 100ths, and 1000ths decimal point. Your student should be able to convert fractions to decimals with a denominator of 10, 100, or 1000, as well as convert a decimal to a fraction. We have also been reading and learning about what plants really need to survive in Science! Ask your student about soilless gardening and see if they can remember what we've talked about! We will continue to learn about plants and even attempt to do some planting ourselves. Our first field trip was in early October to an Apple Farm to learn all about how apples grow including what is required for planting an apple tree. We've been reviewing our map skills in Social Studies and soon will move on to early explorers! As always thank you for your support! The year has gotten off to a fantastic start! All of the grades are learning the classroom procedures and expectations for physical education class. We have discussed the importance of being active not only physically but what it does for us mentally as well. Being active at least one hour a day is our goal at this age.

Our younger students at Washington have learned several bones and muscles. The cardiac muscle (heart) is our most important muscle in our body. Without a strong, healthy heart our daily tasks would be very difficult and we would not feel our very best. Our gluteus maximus muscle, which the students love to say, is the second muscle that they have learned. In physical education class we try to stay off of that muscle as much as possible; the goal is to keep our feet moving the majority of the class period! Ask your student about their phalanges, patellas, and cranium. They will be able to fill you in on the location of those bones as well as some catchy sayings to help them remember where they are. All grades kindergarten through second grade are working on their locomotor skills. It is so important that all of our students know how to slide, gallop, skip, leap, hop, jump and run. It is the basis of all of our movements. We are in the midst learning new recess activities and our soccer unit. Washington School had a visitor from Hockessin, Delaware. "Dr. Recess" spent the day with us teaching everyone new and exciting recess activities. The students worked on their physical skills, social/emotional and cognitive skills. Doctor Curt Hinson travels all over the country presenting his Trouble-Free Playground Program to children. It was an exciting day filled with an abundance of exercisel

In October, the older students will be focusing on how and where to find their pulse. We will be working towards finding out what their own target healthy zone is for when they exercise. This ensures that they are working their heart out at the appropriate level to keep it healthy and strong. We have a Heart-O-Meter in the gym that we will be using on a weekly basis that will reinforce this concept. The students will be finding out what their resting heart rate is which is the first step in finding out what their target heart rate zone is.

Grades 3-5 are practicing their soccer/kicking skills with the football/throwing and catching unit in October. November will bring our bowling/rolling unit. The "glow" bowling with black lights is a hit with all of our Washington students. A field trip to the bowling center for all 4th and 5th grade students will take place in December. You will receive more information about this field trip in November. The cost of the trip to EL RA Bowling Center will be \$2.00 per student. This is a great culminating activity at the end of our bowling unit.



Child Find Notice

"The school district must locate, identify and evaluate all resident children with disabilities, including children with disabilities attending private schools, regardless of the severity of their disabilities." The school district has a special education program to locate and screen all children with suspected disabilities who are residents of the district and who have not graduated from high school. Upon request the school district will screen any resident child who has not graduated high school to determine whether a special education referral is appropriate. A request may be made by contacting Kimberli Peerenboom, Director of Pupil Services for the School District of Janesville at 743-5061, or by writing her at 527 S. Franklin St., Janesville, WI 53548.

Annually the district conducts developmental screening of preschool children. Each child's motor, communication and social skills are observed at various play areas. Each child is weighed and measured, and the child's hearing and vision is checked. The information is used to provide the parents with a profile of their child's current development and to provide suggestions for follow up activities. Parents learn about community services available to them and speak with representatives of agencies serving families. The information from screening is also used to determine whether a child should be evaluated for a suspected disability. When school staff reasonably believe a child is a child with a disability, they refer the child for evaluation by a school district Individualized Education Program (IEP) team. Developmental screening will be a part of the kindergarten screening this Spring. Watch for dates at your local school.

A physician, nurse, psychologist, social worker or administrator of a social agency who reasonably believes a child brought to him or her for services is a child with a disability has a legal duty to report the child to the school district in which the child resides. Before referring the child, the person making the referral must inform the child's parents that the referral will be made. The referral must in writing and include the reason why the person believes the child is a child with a disability. Others who reasonably believe a child is a child with a disability may also refer the child to the school district in which the child resides. A referral of a child residing in the School District of Janesville may be sent to Kimberli Peerenboom at the school district address above.



Aviso Detectar al Niño

"El distrito escolar tiene que localizar, identificar y evaluar a todos los niños residentes con discapacidades, incluyendo a los niños con discapacidades que asisten a escuelas privadas, sin importar la gravedad de sus discapacidades." El distrito escolar tiene un programa de educación especial para localizar y evaluar a todos los niños con presuntas discapacidades, quienes son residentes del distrito y que no se han graduado de la escuela preparatoria. Cuando se solicite, el distrito escolar evaluará a cualquier niño residente que no se haya graduado de la escuela preparatoria para determinar, si es apropiada una referencia para educación especial. Una solicitud puede hacerse contactando a Kimberli Peerenboom, Director de Servicios al alumno del Distrito Escolar de Janesville al 743-5061, o escribiéndole a: 527 S. Franklin St., Janesville WI 53548.

Anualmente el distrito lleva a cabo evaluaciones del desarrollo de los niños en edad preescolar. Cada una de las habilidades motoras, comunicativas y sociales del niño son observadas en varias áreas de juego. Se pesa y mide a cada niño y su audición y visión son revisadas. Se utiliza la información para proporcionar al padre un perfil del desarrollo actual de su niño y proveer sugerencias para las actividades de seguimiento. Los padres aprenden acerca de los servicios comunitarios disponibles para ellos y hablan con representantes de agencias que dan servicio a las familias. La información de la evaluación también se utiliza para determinar si un niño debe ser examinado por presunta discapacidad. Cuando el personal de la escuela razonablemente cree que un niño, es un niño con una discapacidad, refieren al niño para una evaluación por el equipo del Programa Educativo Individualizado (IEP) del distrito escolar. Las evaluaciones del desarrollo serán parte de las examinaciones del kínder esta primavera. Espere las fechas en su escuela local.

Un doctor, enfermera, sicólogo, trabajador social o administrador de una agencia social que razonablemente crea que un niño que se le llevó para recibir atención es un niño con una discapacidad, tiene el deber legal de reportar al niño al distrito escolar en el cual el niño reside. Antes de referir al niño, la persona que hace la referencia tiene que informar a los padres del niño que se hará la referencia. La referencia tiene que ser por escrito e incluir la razón por la cual la persona cree que el niño, es un niño con una discapacidad. Otros quienes razonablemente crean que un niño, es un niño con una discapacidad, pueden también referir al niño al distrito escolar en el cual el niño reside. Una referencia de un niño que reside en el Distrito Escolar de Janesville puede enviarse a Kimberli Peerenboom a la dirección de arriba del distrito escolar.

Public School Open Enrollment Timelines

The state of Wisconsin has announced the application period for open enrollment (also known as public school choice) begins in February for the following school year. Open Enrollment laws permit children to attend a public school in a school district other than the one in which they live.

The open enrollment application period for the 2018-2019 school year is from February 5, 2018-April 30, 2018. Parents are encouraged to apply on-line at https://www2.dpi.state.wi.us/OpenEnrollApp. Although on-line application is recommended, paper applications may be obtained from the Department of Public Instruction or any school district after January 15, 2018 and must be delivered (hand delivery is recommended) to the nonresident school district during the application period. Paper applications to attend Janesville must be submitted to the Administrative Services Department no later than 4:00 p.m. on April 30th (a postmark does not constitute timely submission). Applications turned in prior to February 5th will be returned as not valid and must be resubmitted after February 5th but before April 30th.

Enrollment in a requested school or program is subject to space and other limitations and is not guaranteed. Transportation is the responsibility of the parent.

Under School District of Janesville board policy, students who attended the district under open enrollment the previous year are not required to reapply for the following school year.

An application is required for each sibling in the family. For example, if a family has one child in elementary school that has been approved for open enrollment and a new student entering kindergarten next year, the student entering kindergarten must apply for open enrollment in order to attend the School District of Janesville.

Parents will be informed in June whether their open enrollment applications have been approved or denied. The student's school or program placement will be provided in June.

Dear Parent/Guardian:

Under the "No Child Left Behind Act of 2001" federal law schools receiving federal Title I funds are required to notify parents of their right to ask for and receive information on the qualifications of their child's teacher(s). Specifically, you have the right to request the following:

- ⇒ Whether your child's teacher has met state qualification and licensing criteria for the grade levels and subject areas in which he or she teaches.
- ⇒ Whether your child's teacher is teaching under emergency or other provisional status through which state qualification or licensing criteria have been waived.
- ⇒ The baccalaureate degree major of your child's teacher and any other graduate certification or degree held by the teacher.
- \Rightarrow Whether your child is provided services by instructional aides and, if so, their qualifications.

All teachers in the School District of Janesville have a bachelor's degree and a large percentage have advanced degrees. In addition, all instructional aides meet current school district qualification. You can check on the state certification of your child's teacher by accessing the Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction website https://elo.wieducatorlicensing.org/datamart/publicSearchMenu.do or by contacting me at 743-7205

Periodo de Inscripción Abierta para las Escuelas Públicas

El Estado de Wisconsin ha anunciado que el periodo de aplicaciones para inscripción abierta (también conocido como preferencia de escuela pública), comienza en febrero para el próximo año escolar. Las leyes de Inscripción Abierta permiten que los niños asistan a una escuela pública en un distrito escolar, fuera del distrito en el que viven.

El periodo de solicitud para Inscripción Abierta para el año escolar 2018-19, es del 5 de febrero y el 30 abril de 2018. Se recomienda que los padres llenen su solicitud por internet en: https://www2.dpi.state.wi.us/OpenEnrollApp. Aunque se recomienda la solicitud por internet, pueden obtenerse los formularios de solicitud en el Departamento de Instrucción Pública o en cualquier distrito escolar, después del 15 de enero de 2018 y tienen que entregarse (se recomienda la entrega en persona) al distrito escolar de no residencia, durante el periodo de solicitud. Las solicitudes tienen que entregarse en el Departamento de Servicios Administrativos, antes del las 4:00 p.m. del 30 abril (un sello del correo no constituye la entrega oportuna). Las solicitudes entregadas antes del 5 de febrero, serán devueltas como no válidas y tendrán que ser presentadas de nuevo después del 5 de febrero, pero antes del 30 abril.

La inscripción en un programa o en una escuela que se solicita, está sujeta al espacio y a otras limitaciones y no está garantizada. La transportación es responsabilidad de los padres.

Bajo la política del comité del Distrito Escolar de Janesville, los estudiantes que asistieron al distrito bajo la inscripción abierta el año anterior, no necesitan llenar una solicitud de nuevo para el año escolar siguiente.

Se requiere una solicitud para cada niño en la familia. Por ejemplo, si una familia tiene un niño en la primaria que ha sido aprobado para la inscripción abierta y a un nuevo estudiante entrando al Kínder el próximo año, el estudiante entrando al Kínder tiene que aplicar para la inscripción abierta, para poder asistir al Distrito Escolar de Janesville.

Se les informará a los padres en el mes de Abril, si su solicitud de inscripción abierta ha sido aprobada o rechazada. La colocación en el programa o escuela del estudiante, será notificada en el mes de Mayo.

Request for School Transfer/Placement (Intra District Transfers) within the School District of Janesville Attendance Areas

Due to Move:

If you move <u>w ithin</u> the School District of Janesville during the school year and w ish to remain at your current school please ask the school office for a <u>Reguest to Remain in Current School Following Move to New Attendance Area Form</u> (Blue). Complete the form and return it to the school office.

Due to Parent Choice:

If you wish to apply to have your student transferred/placed in another school within the district next school year (2018-2019), please ask the school office for a School Transfer/Placement Within the School District Form (Goldenrod). Completed forms will be accepted from December 1 through December 15, 2017 only. Submit your request, for School Transfer/Placement Within the School District Form (Goldenrod), to your home school attendance area office. Parents applying for requests for school transfer/placement within the school district will be notified of approval or disapproval by January 15, 2018. Parents applying for requests for school transfer/placement within the school district for incoming kindergarten students will be notified of approval or non-approval after they have enrolled their child during the kindergarten enrollment period with the New Student Enrollment Office. If you have guestions, please contact the school office of your home school attendance area.

Open Enrollment - Public School Choice - District to District Transfers

If during the school year, you move outside the School District of Janesville and you wish to remain at your current school please contact the Administrative Services office at 743-5006 and request a tuition waiver form within two weeks of your move. This will allow you to be eligible to attend your current school for the remainder of the current year tuition free. If your move occurs prior to February, you will also need to complete an open enrollment application. Application instructions are provided to the School District of Janesville by the Department of Public Instruction (DPI) and should be available by mid January 2018. This year applications will be accepted **February 5 – April 30, 2018**.

Kindergarten Enrollment 2018-2019 School Year

SCHOOL DISTRICT RESIDENTS

If you have a child turning 5 (five) years old on or before September 1, 2018 and they are <u>not</u> currently enrolled in a School District of Janesville Pre-school for Janesville (P4J) or Early Childhood (EC) program it is time to enroll in the Janesville Public School District. Enrollment will take place at the Educational Services Center located at 527 S. Franklin St. (administration building) in the New Student Enrollment office. You may enroll anytime during the two week period.

If you cannot attend the enrollment period please come in as soon as possible to enroll after December 15, 2017. Enrollment in the district is <u>required</u> for participation in orientation. When you enroll, you will need your child's birth certificate for proof of age, proof of residency (top portion of a utility bill, or current lease) to determine school assignment, immunization records and photo identification. If you have questions on general enrollment, please contact the New Student Enrollment office at 743-5152 during regular office hours, 8:00 a.m. – 5:00 p.m.

Requests for school transfer/placement within the School District (goldenrod forms) for incoming kindergarten students should be submitted through the enrollment process. Forms are available at all schools, as well as at the Educational Services Center. If you have questions regarding this process contact Tami Carlson at 743-5006. The status of requests will be determined by January 15, 2018 if they are turned in by December 15th. If you have a student currently attending a school under a school transfer/placement within the school district, **it does not automatically** qualify your kindergarten student for attendance at the same school; however, siblings are generally assigned to the same school. In order for your kindergarten student to attend the same school as a sibling, you must submit a request during the kindergarten enrollment time frame.

If you know of a child in your neighborhood or from community activities that would be entering kindergarten for the 2018-2019 school year, please pass this enrollment information on.

Non-District Residents

If you are a non-resident of the School District of Janesville and have a child turning 5 (five) years on or before September 1, 2018 and would like your child to attend the School District of Janesville you must also apply for **OPEN ENROLLMENT**. The timeline for Open Enrollment is February 5 to April 30, 2018. Currently enrolled non-residents in a P4J or EC program do not need to re-apply.
