At Brandon Valley, we have a time capsule that is opened at the end of your senior year. We asked each student to take a picture of themselves in their house (Crib). These pictures were taken in their favorite place to hang out, their favorite part of the house, or a space that makes their house unique.● Bonus Field Trip: With the weather being nice and families riding bikes or walking outside. Take a minute to write your favorite school moment, experience, or favorite memory from this past year on the sidewalk or driveway of your house. Next to it write what team you were on. This field trip will be a fun way to connect and reflect on the school year!

You can write about anything related to your 6th grade year. Here are some suggestions.

1. How have you changed over the past year?
2. What do you not want to forget about 6th grade?
3. Who are your friends?
4. What do you like to do in your free time?
5. What are your favorite things (songs, movies, tv shows, food, class/subject, sports team, book, etc.)?
6. What do you want to be when you grow up?
7. Do you want to go to college? If so, where?
8. What do you think you will remember most about your pandemic experience?
9. How do you think experiencing COVID19 has changed you?

Using the answers to the questions above, write a letter to yourself that you will receive your senior year of high school. You can also include anything from your 6th grade year that you may want to remember.

When your letter is completed, if you would like to have it placed in the time capsule, please turn it in at the school or email it to your homeroom teacher.

On Wednesday, May 20th the 6th Grade students and teachers will be taking a virtual field trip. The theme for our field trip is BVIS Cribbs (a spin on *MTV Cribbs*).
