<p><u>Homemade Play Dough Recipe:</u> Combine the following: 1 C flour, 1/2C salt, 2 T cream of tartar and place in a saucepan. Add 1 C. water, 1 T oil and a few drops of your favorite food coloring. Heat over medium heat, stirring constantly until it starts to form a ball and pull away from the sides of the pan. (around 3 minutes) Remove the pan and knead the playdough. Let cool before packaging. Keep in an airtight container or bag. What can you sculpt out of your playdough?</p>
