<p>Shaping</p> <p>Use your words to create a picture.</p>  <p>Use each word as many times as needed.</p>	<p>Bubble Letters</p> <p>Write your words using bubble letters.</p> 	<p>Stairway/Triangle Spell</p> <p>W We Wed Wedn Wedne Wednes Wednesd Wednesda Wednesday</p>
<p>Spellamadoodle</p> <p>Print your words filling up the whole sheet. Write the words in different directions and more than once. Colored pencils/markers/crayons can be used.</p>	<p>Itty Bitty</p> <p>For each word, make a list of as many words as you can using only the letters in the word. You can rearrange letters, but only use letters once unless they are repeated in the original word.</p>	<p>Cut & Paste</p> <p>Cut out letters from newspapers, magazines, old flyers, or other print materials. Then paste your words together, letter by letter on paper..</p>
<p>Vowel/Consonant Color</p> <p>Write each word using blue for consonants and red for vowels (a, e, i, o, u)</p>	<p>Type</p> <p>Type a list of your words. Your choice of font and/or colors. Just make sure the words are legible.</p>	<p>Cursive</p> <p>Write your words using your best effort cursive.</p>
<p>Word Search</p> <p>Create your own word search using all the words on your spelling list.</p>	<p>Rainbow Write</p> <p>Write each word five times using five different colors.</p>	<p>Words and Nature</p> <p>Practice your words using rocks, sticks, sand, chalk on driveway or any other outdoor way.</p>
<p>Word Art</p> <p>Use paint, glitter, pipe cleaners, or any other crafty material to create your words.</p>	<p>Create a Crossword</p> <p>Create clues for each word and crossword boxes. Then give it to a family member to solve.</p>	<p>Creative Juices</p> <p>Create a short story, poem, comic or riddle using all your words.</p>
