

Total Solar Eclipse, Mon. April 8th, 12:30 - 3:00 PM

Eastern lowa is positioned to experience a partial solar eclipse during the April 8th, 2024 Total Eclipse Event. We will experience 89% totality when the maximum coverage peaks at 2:01 PM. The partial eclipse begins at 12:46 PM and lasts until 3:16 PM. All who stop by during the event will receive a free pair of eclipse glasses plus enjoy some solar eclipse games and activities! If the eclipse is not visible due to clouds, we will also be playing NASA's live coverage on the big screen. If you're unable to join us at the library on April 8th, free eclipse glasses will be available

the week prior (supplies are limited). And according to NASA, this will be the last total solar eclipse visible from the contiguous U.S. until August 2044!
