<u>Course</u>: Algebra 1 & Algebra 1 Lab – Your child has been enrolled in both Algebra 1 & Algebra 1 Lab. While it is technically two different courses with two separate grades, I am the teacher for both and it is the same time each day. Simply put, your child will receive Math instruction every day versus every other day – this is a benefit! This will help to strengthen their understanding of Math while also providing them with more in-class time to comprehend our skills.

Extra-Help: I am available weekly on Monday & Thursday during SAP in my classroom from 1:55-2:25pm. I also am available before school from 7:00-7:20am and if needed, I am available during my lunch (Block B-C). *It is important for your child to ask for help/seek additional support, when needed.*

NEW Late Work Policy (LBHS):

Students will earn up to 80% for any assignment turned in after the due date and up until the cutoff dates.

Students will earn up to 65% for any assignment turned in beyond the cutoff date.

After the stated cutoff dates, students will have the opportunity to turn in the assignment for <u>a max grade of a 65%</u> (for the remainder for the marking period).

UPDATED* School Uniform Policy:

Dear Long Branch Families,

The Long Branch Public Schools has updated the dress and grooming policy, which reflects "Uniformity of Dress" for all Preschool - Grade 12 students. Students are required to wear any combination of the following, which will be strictly enforced:

- Pants, Shorts, Jumpers and/or Skorts in <u>Khaki</u> or <u>Black</u> color
- Collared Golf/Polo Shirts, Short or Long-Sleeved, in White, Gray or Dark Green
- Collared Shirt Exceptions: Turtlenecks and blouses in dark green, white or gray
- All shirts must have the Long Branch Public Schools Emblem Patch

*Middle and High School Students Only - In addition to a solid green, grey, or white collared shirt, students will be permitted to wear a Long Branch Middle or High School affiliated non-collared shirt. This non-collared shirt can be that of the school uniform or be from an extra-curricular activity within the school (i.e. Athletics, VPA, club, etc.).

Mrs. Lompado's Classroom Expectations – Algebra 1:

- 1. Attendance/Late Below is a list of the bell schedule.
 - Students receive 4 minutes between classes to transition to their next room. They will be marked late if they are not there by the time the bell rings.
 - For Block A, the first bell rings at 7:20 with class officially starting at 7:30. If late, *a student must sign* in with the office before coming to class.

1. Cell Phone Policy - Cell phones must remain <u>AWAY</u> in this class. (There will be some days where I allow students to listen to music while completing work but this would be a "special occasion".) If a student is using their phone, I will first ask them to put it away. If it happens again, I ask them to set their phone on the front table (I do not "take" the phones as I understand this is their property).

2. Assignments-

Homework & Classwork - Given regularly in this course. As mentioned above, each assignment will have a due date. If the assignment is late, it will receive an 80%. Once the cutoff date passes, the assignment will receive a 65%. There is no extra-credit in this course.

Do Now & Exit Tickets - Given at the beginning/end of each class. Smaller "checks"

Quizzes/Tests – There will be (1) quiz and (1) test per chapter. We typically have 2-3 chapters per marking period. We will <u>always</u> conduct a full review before a test. There are no "make-ups".

- If a student is absent the day of the review, they will be given ONE additional day to prepare before taking the exam.
- If a student is absent the day of the test, the student will be given TWO days to schedule a time to complete the test, before points are deducted. (Reason being we will be reviewing the exam & moving on to the next chapter).
- 3. Classroom Structure Students will be seated independently, 3 feet apart. I will incorporate group work via white boards where students will be able to communicate and learn together, while still remaining socially-distanced. Each student will be given a number that will correspond to their specific seat, calculator, and chrome-book.

- 4. Classroom Management Students will receive per Marking Period:
 - 3 "Bathroom" passes
 - 2 "I need a break" passes
 - o Allows students to step into the hallway, talk a brief walk, put their head down for 5 minutes.
 - 1 "Handle with Care" pass
 - O Allows a student to work quietly that day without much interaction from me/other students; essentially allowing students to have a "bad" day .. we all have those once in a while!
 - **At the end of each marking period, students will be rewarded if they did not use any passed.**
- 5. Inappropriate Behavior Should a student demonstrate inappropriate behavior:
 - 1st: Speak directly to the student about the incident/situation
 - 2nd: Contact the parent/guardian
 - 3rd: Write a formal disciplinary referral to the administration team.
 - **Depending on the severity of the situation, 2 & 3 may happen together.

Examples include foul language, disrespect to myself/others/school property, not following instructions/direction, sleeping through class, cutting class, cheating/copying, instigating, use of cellphone, etc. **I have no tolerance for bullying.**

6. District Covid Procedures- (Copied from Long Branch Public District Website)

Protocols for Symptomatic Students:

- Students are excluded from school with a temperature higher than 100.4. *Students may return to school after 24 hours if fever free without fever reducing medication and NO other symptoms.*
- Students who have a temperature higher than 100.4 and any COVID symptoms are excluded for a minimum of 72 hours. A doctor's not upon return to school is recommended.
- It is the Parents'/Guardians' responsibility to ensure their child is healthy to attend school.

At School:

- All students will be rescreened at the building entrance prior to entering the buildings. Any student who shows symptoms will be escorted to an isolation room where a medical professional will conduct further screening. In the event that a student's symptom is confirmed, the parent will be contacted to pick up the student from school and keep the student home until the symptoms subside.
- If a student becomes ill or symptomatic while at school: the teacher will call the Nurse's office to let the nurse know a student is ill. Upon the Nurse's direction, a safe school employee/corridor aide will go to the classroom and escort the student to the isolation* room where the Nurse will screen, access, and provide care.
 - o The Nurse would follow district protocols regarding a sick child and contact home.

COVID Symptoms: (*May appear 2-14 days after exposure*)
