Logistics & Details

Traditional School Year

- Semester System: 6 classes per semester
- School Day: 8:30 am-3:00 pm
- Schedule:
 - Mondays and Fridays: Attend all 6 classes
 - 56 minute classes
 - Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays:
 Block Days- attend 4 classes
 - 86 minute classes
- Lunch: 11:30 am everyday
- Early Release Wednesdays- School ends at 12:30 pm and the buses leave at 1:00 pm

Hybrid School Year

- Quarter System: 3 classes per quarter
- Cohort A and Cohort B
- School Day: 8:40 am-1:40 pm and 8:40 am-11:45 am
- Schedule:
 - Monday-Thursday: Attend all 3 classes either in CDL or in-person
 - 90 minute classes
 - Friday: Attend all 3 classes either in CDL or in-person
 - 55 minute classes
- Lunch:
 - Monday-Thursday: 1:40 pm
 - o Friday: 11:45 am

Helpful Hints for High School

- Check grades and attendance regularly online in StudentVUE

- Applied Arts: Variety of introductory and advanced courses and clubs


Important Upcoming Dates
