Conferences or Concerns



For the Love of Reading ...



Read, Read, Read!

Now is the time to instill a love of reading with your child. As a parent I understand how busy and exhausting the evenings can be. I do not send home written homework because I want the children to take the time to read. Make sure that they read a minimum of 15 minutes a day at home outside of their school day.

Reading fluency, expression, spelling, writing skills, comprehension and expanding their background knowledge are all a result of READING.

Reading Fluency

Reading fluency is the ability to read smoothly, accurately and with expression with very little phonetic decoding (sounding out words).

Reading Comprehension

Comprehension is when a reader understands what they have read and is able to extract important information from the text, such as details about a character or setting. Additionally, a child is able to sequence events of a story by verbal or written expression in the correct order or is able to summarize the main ideas of a story.

Choosing the Right Level Book

The worst thing you can do for a struggling reader is to allow them to attempt to read a chapter book that they truly cannot read. Your child will be frustrated and this will only undermine their confidence and desire to continue to read. Also, children who are higher level readers should not be choosing books that are too simple either. Remember the goal is to develop and encourage ALL readers at THEIR level.

So what to do?

Guide your child to select a book and open the book in the middle of the story. Ask your child to read one page in the center of the book. If your child cannot read more than five words on that particular page, then that book selection is too hard for their reading ability. It is better to master a book at their reading level, than to begin hating to read!

Assessments

Your child will be assessed both informally and/or formally in and out of the classroom setting depending on the area being evaluated. For academics both informal and formal assessments will be used (a list is provided below).

However, other areas that may only include informal assessment may include use of the bathroom, transitioning and moving in the hallways, recess, lunch and dismissal.
