Homework:

Reading: I beg you to be sure your child reads every night. I'm not even going to give a time – 5 minutes or 5 hours. Just read. Please see the note about why you should have your child read at home.

<u>Math:</u> Second grade standards require students to know the addition and subtraction basic facts to/from 20. This means no fingers or counting on or back. When you state the fact, they can say the answer.

Reading Counts:

Reading Counts is a comprehension quiz. Some of the books your child reads will be included in Reading Counts. Our library

books are marked specifically if they have Reading Counts quizzes. Books are varied in point value. In second grade we strive to achieve the following levels:

20 points - Cub Reader

40 points – Lion Reader

60 points - King of Reading

Those levels start back at zero at the beginning of each quarter.

Birthdays:

If your child is celebrating a birthday, you are welcome to send in birthday treats. It is easiest for us if you leave them in the office or send them with your child. We don't have birthday parties in class; we just enjoy a treat as a way to celebrate. We fit in the treats when it works best in our day. Please send things in individual servings as we have no way to cut something in our classroom. If you are sending birthday invitations, they are only allowed to be handed out in class if all the students in the class are invited.
