Technology K-2

Western Union Elementary School recognizes that technology is an important tool for today's student. For this reason, computer classes are provided for all students K-5.

Grades 3-5 have chrome books in their classes which encourages student to work more efficiently and also accept the responsibility of taking care of their individual computer.

In **Grade 3** students are introduced to higher level skills. Their passwords change to a more complex combination of letters, numbers and symbols. Students also are introduced to Google Drive and Google Classroom for the first time.

In the computer lab students are working on their first Google Classroom assignment which is in Google Slides. Each student will create a presentation with their thoughts and ideas of what they would do if they were President.

Fourth Grade students will be traveling the world. Using PowerPoint they will draw a "Flat Stanley" version of themselves. This image will then be superimposed over pictures of the places they would like to visit with a brief explanation of that location.

Fifth Grade is creating a Slide Presentation on a State and Capital. They will combine research, writing and geography skills in one project.

The **Computer Lab** has started off with a bang this year and everything is going extremely well! This first semester the students in K-2 are learning/reviewing the Rules and Procedures for the Lab, as well as required WUES drills, i.e., Code 500 Lockdown Drill, Fire Drill, and Tornado Drill. Student safety is our #1 priority at WUES! ©

Your Kinders have been learning the components of a computer; the keyboard, mouse, monitor and processor. We're honing in on their mousing skills, as many have difficulty with pointing and clicking, but practice makes perfect! They are being very patient, even though they're beyond anxious and excited to get to play games! (What they don't realize is they're all *educational* games, so sometimes ignorance is bliss!) They love it all! I'm so proud of my Kindergartners this year, they're an outstanding group! ©

The first few weeks the 1st graders have been learning the arduous task of "Logging In" to the computers again. Many forget over the summer, so this is just a gentle reminding ritual. © Upon login, they're learning how to access the internet via Google Chrome, access school-approved websites, such as Starfall, ABCya and PBSkids. They love ALL of these sites and you may access them at home if you any device with the internet.

Our 2nd graders jumped right into Loggin In with little effort or reminders, YAY! Now we're finding the websites mentioned above and learning the meaning of "Bookmark" and bookmarking the sites permissible. I've taught them that it's just like bookmarking your page in a book you're reading, but on the computer with the click of a button! Easy peasy!

Grades K-2 students will focus more on the skills of different sports and activities, while grades 3-5 students will combine skills with game tactics.


I am excited about the new year and look forward to seeing everyone in class each week.
