### **Extended Question/Speaking and Listening**

- What makes the world wonderful to you?
- What color are your favorite flowers?
- Do you like the sun moon or stars the most and why?
- Let see what colors make up a rainbow?

### **Vocabulary**

- **Bloom-** to flourish or thrive.
- **Sky-**the upper atmosphere of the earth
- **Clouds-**the visible collection of particles of water or ice suspended in air.
- **Bright-**Radiating or reflecting light.

### **Drawing activities for toddlers or preschoolers**

#### **Materials**

- Crayons
- Stickers
- Construction paper.

A great way to keep your child active while developing creativity and emotional skills is to ask the child to draw a picture representing his or her feelings. Let him or her draw freely, there is no right or wrong answer.

Discuss why he or she drew that picture; let him or her explain how he or she feels. Encourage the child to use words like happy, sad, etc. and explore other emotions. Encourage conversation to improve the development of vocabulary.



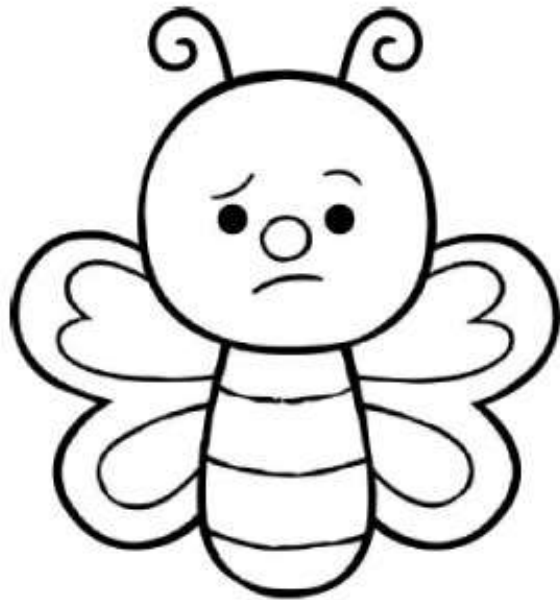
### Scavenger hunt.
