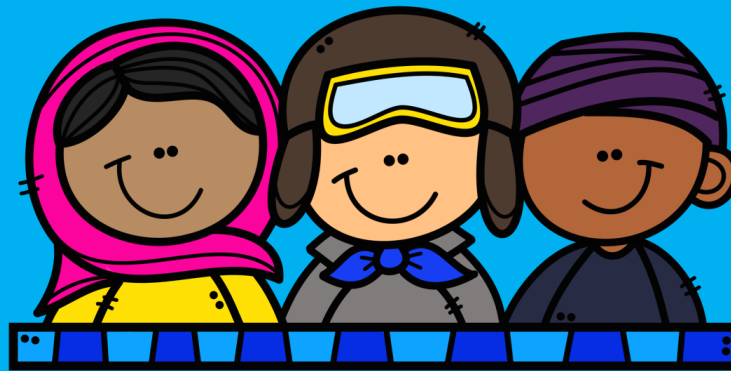


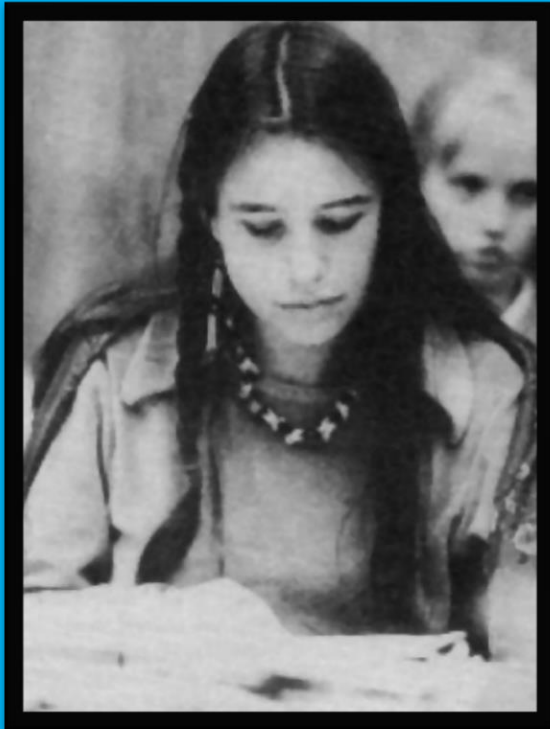

A Home Away From Home

Winona LaDuke was born in California in 1959. Her father was a Native American born from the Ojibwe tribe. If the people of this tribe wanted to live together, they had to live in Minnesota on a spot of land called a reservation. LaDuke's father did not live there because he wanted to be an actor. Winona grew up being a part of the tribe but not living with them. Instead, she grew up thousands of miles away in California and Oregon.



Although Winona did not grow up with her tribe, her father taught her all the traditions and customs of his people. Nature is very important to the Ojibwe Tribe. They believe that we must love the earth and take care of it. Winona would grow up to fight for this cause. She would become an environmentalist, someone who wants to make the world a cleaner place.

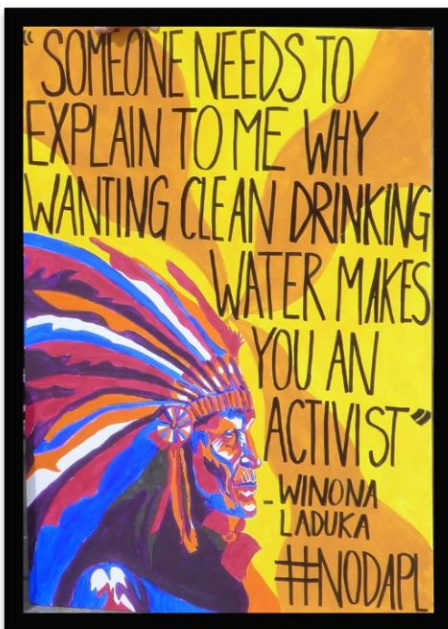

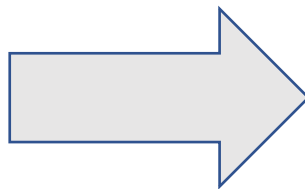

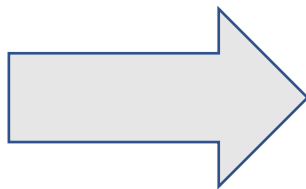
