Sharing our Data: How we have been meeting your students' needs


We, the counselors at WJH, have been keeping track of the content of our meetings with individual students to better gauge what our students' needs are as a whole.


One of the reasons we are collecting data is because it allows us to attend trainings on topics that are of high concern in our building, as well as to plan for future small group and classroom curriculum that reflects the needs of our students. To the right is a graph showing the presenting concern of the students who we have met with individually so far this school year.

In addition to this general information we also tracked students' specific Academic,

Personal/Social, and College/Career concerns. To the right is a graph demonstrating the specifics topics we have been addressing in our most common individual meeting category: Personal/Social. The numbers on the graph represent the total amount of students with that presenting concern.

Highlights from Quarter Two...

Small Group Meetings

We now have four Breakfast Clubs up and running during which we meet with students regarding grades and then set goals for the week.

Both the boys' and girls' 7th/8th Breakfast Clubs earned rewards Quarter 2 by reaching their goals! The girls group received breakfast cooked for them by our Assistant Principals and served by Mrs. Link while our boys group got to have pizza delivery for lunch! 9th grade boys' and girls' groups also met their collective academic goal for Quarter 2 and will receive the same rewards in the coming weeks!

Classroom Lessons

Mrs. Richter and Ms. Gerster were in 7^{th} and 8^{th} grade classes presenting on careers this quarter.

In 7th grade we discussed the **Areas** of Interest and the future Academies of Shakopee. Students then logged onto Family Connections to take a survey that gave them their top career clusters. After, we related those results back to Areas of Interest and what classes they might want to register for in 8th grade.



In 8th grade classrooms we talked about our **strengths and interests** and how those relate to the Areas of Interest and Academies. Students then logged onto Family Connections and took both the Strengths Finder, which identified their strengths as they relate to careers, and the Career Key, which gave them results from Holland's Code and the careers that matched with those results. Students then used this information to do a career project in their social studies class.

Connect to College & Career

In Quarter 2 we had a lot of fun with Connect to College & Career!

November: Military Trivia was played in GPS classes. We also had the Marine Corps Challenge at lunch where students could try to do squats/push-ups while wearing a weighted vest and holding a 23pound block; we had a lot of students who took the challenge and did REALLY well! In addition to the challenge we also had a Military Q & A panel that students could sign up for. Those who attended had lots of thoughtful questions and overall great discussion at this event.

December: During lunch we presented real college/career facts about staff members at WJH and asked students to 'Guess Who'!

January: College/Career vocab was explored through a fun game called 'Heads Up' in GPS. Students also played 'Hangman' at lunch for candy to learn more college terms.

Each month we were able to give at least 15 prizes of college and military apparel away for participation!
