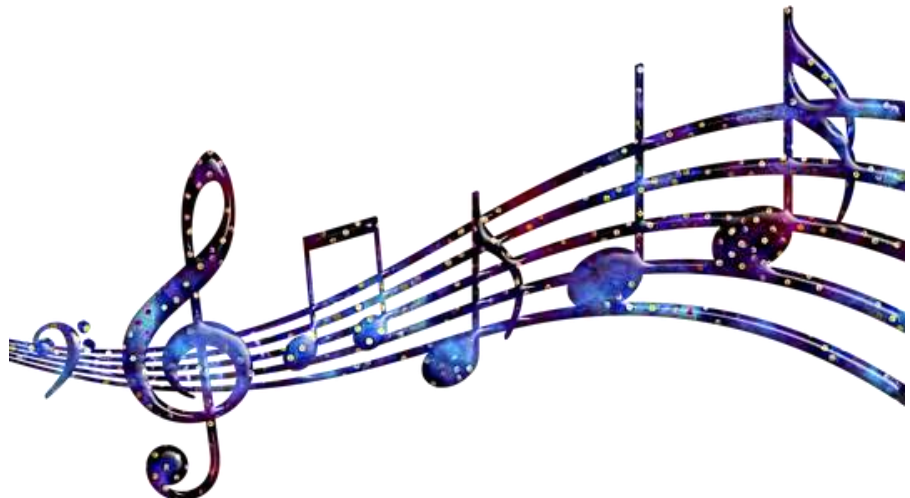

The MCHS business department offers the following business classes: Introduction to Accounting, Advanced Accounting, Banking and Investment Capstone, Business Law and Ethics, Web Design, Digital Applications and Responsibility, Introduction to Computer Science, Computer Science 1, Cyber Security, AP Computer Science Principles, Business Math, Personal Financial Responsibility, Principles of Business Management, Introduction to Business, Computer Tech Support and Preparing for College and Careers

### NEW Business classes this year -

## Student Tech Zone

The Student Tech Zone is up and running for the third straight year. This class allows the students to learn and run the Student Tech Zone. The Student Tech Zone is the high school help desk for all the Chromebooks. Students will learn how to reimage chromebooks and troubleshoot hardware and software problems. We started the year with a number of machines that needed repairs. The repairs range from random shut off, bad batteries, cracked screens or keyboard fixes. Once we troubleshoot the problem we fix the chromebook, test to ensure the fix worked and then return the chromebook back to its owner. We are happy to report that the Student Tech Zone support room is open from 7:00 a.m. to 2:25 p.m. in room A215. When we are not fixing chromebooks we will be studying for our A+ certification exam.

**Sophomore Chromebooks** – if your son or daughter has not received their new chromebook they can pick it up in room A215. They must have their Parent/Guardian Chromebook Consent and Insurance Form filled out and signed. While insurance is optional it is highly recommended that you purchase it. This insurance cost is \$30.00 for the year. Replace and repair cost if you choose not to take insurance is: entire chromebook: \$180.00, repair of the screen - \$80.00 and repair of the keyboard - \$45. Prices for repairs are subject to change.

### MCHS MCJROTC HONORS OUR NATION



As most Americans were beaching, barbecuing, or watching fireworks during Independence Day week, the cadets of the Michigan City High School (MCHS) Marine Corps Junior Reserve Officer Training Corps (MCJROTC) were honoring our Nation by participating in two patriotic events. They carried an oversized flag in the Michigan City Patriotic Parade on June 29 with the help of the Michigan City Police Department summer campers. They also marched in the LaPorte Independence Day Parade on July 4<sup>th</sup>. Additionally in June, the cadets provided the Color Guard for the Indiana Vol-

unteer Firefighters Association convention at the Blue Chip Casino in Michigan City and assisted the Salvation Army in a fundraiser.

"This time of year is of course a big vacation period. I admire our cadets for their unselfishness to participate in events that remind us that our country's freedom is not something that we should take for granted," said Senior Marine Instructor Major Tom McGrath.



Master Sergeant Jeff Benak, the Marine Instructor, commented on the patriotism of the cadets. "Many people today say that kids don't appreciate the sacrifices made by those who fought and died for our country. They need to look at our cadets and the number of public affairs events in which they participate, reminding everyone of the great country in which we live." Last school year, the MCHS cadets participated in 45 events which involved their

Color Guard. Additionally, they were involved with 68 different community service activities.

Cadets have been working over the summer to improve their military drill skills for the upcoming year. Four cadets will be attending a drill camp at Texas A&M

University in College Station, Texas from July 7th-13th. "Our goal is to not only qualify for the Marine National Championship as we have done in the last two years, but to win it," said McGrath. The camp, to include the round-trip flight, will not cost MCHS or the cadets anything. It is completely funded by the Marine Corps. Additionally, three more cadets will attend a Senior Leadership Camp in Boswell, PA from July 21<sup>st</sup>-28<sup>th</sup>. Similarly, this camp is also fully funded by the Marine Corps.

The capstone event for the cadets' summer activities will be to assist in the preparation and running of the Back-To-School Rally on August 8<sup>th</sup>. This is an opportunity for Michigan City Area School students to obtain free school supplies donated by generous stores in Michigan City.

#### MCHS MCJROTC CADETS ATTEND

#### NATIONAL MILITARY DRILL CAMP

Cadets from the Michigan City High School (MCHS) Marine Corps Junior Reserve Officer Training Corps (MCJROTC) attended the National Drill Camp conducted by Sports Network International (SNI) at Texas A&M University in College Station, Texas from July 7-13. SNI also conducts the National Marine and All-Service Drill Championship meets. Cadets 1<sup>st</sup> Lieutenant Bohdan Walker, 2<sup>nd</sup> Lieutenants Jessica Wilhelm and Julia Ringstad, and Lance Corporal Hanna Lucas participated in the camp at no cost to them or MCHS. The Marine Corps funded the camp, to include the round trip flight.



The objective of the camp was to provide the techniques and strategies that make a champion drill team. The instructors at the camp came from schools that have been perennial competitors at national championship meets. MCHS cadets came away from the camp with the knowledge of what it takes to win a national championship, and the motivation and confidence that it can be done at Michigan City.



"We have qualified the last two years for the Marine National Championship," said Senior Marine Instructor Major Tom McGrath. "This year, we want to do more than qualify. It is a great honor to be one of 16 schools out of the 250 nationally to make it, but I have the confidence that our cadets can win the whole thing."

Master Sergeant Jeff Benak, the Marine Instructor, also was optimistic about next

year's drill team. "Although we lost many seniors, we have some really motivated underclassmen ready to take their place."

The cadets will remain busy through the summer. In addition to voluntary drill practices, three cadets will be attending a Senior Leadership Camp in Boswell, PA, from July 21-27. Cadets will be assisting with the set-up and running of the Michigan City Area Schools (MCAS) Back-To-School Rally on August 8<sup>th</sup> at the old Elston practice football field. The rally provides free school supplies for all MCAS students. Cadets will also assist with Freshmen Orientation on August 13<sup>th</sup>, the day prior to classes starting for all MCAS schools.
