Prom Reminder!!



Hi Juniors and Seniors!

Prom tickets sales are still on going. Here are the facts you need to know, read carefully:

- Tickets are ONLY sold on Monday, Wednesday, and Thursday. Anyone coming to purchase on a Tuesday or Friday will be turned away.
- You must be in line in the 500 building to purchase before 8:25 am or you will not be sold a ticket that day.
- We are checking fees at the door so if you have any that you are already aware of, you could save yourself some time by going to the office first and paying them. If you come to get in line and then find out at the first station that you have fees, you will be turned away to go to the office.
- If you are a flex student currently or an early grad, reach out to Gill or Chaffin with any questions ASAP: nicole.gill@ucps.k12.nc.us or Jodi.chaffin@ucps.k12.nc.us
- As of Monday, May 6th, ticket price goes up to \$75 for the final week before prom.
- Ticket sales END on THURSDAY, May 9th. If you haven't purchased your ticket by the Thursday before Prom, you are not going to prom. No tickets will be sold on Friday May 10th or at Prom on the 11th.

When you get to Prom on Saturday May 11th, make sure you and your date have your photo ID on you or a picture of your photo ID on your phone. You must show this at the door of Prom to be admitted into Prom. **There are no physical "tickets**," it's just a check in guest list with your names so ID is required.





- 3. Complete the FAFSA responsibility form
- 4 Once accepted commit to Wingate by submitting your enrollment deposit.

Gateway Scholarship FAQs

- Our admission application is FREE. There is no separate application for the scholarship. High school students should submit our first-year undergraduate application. High school graduates (those who completed community college courses after graduating from high school) should use the transfer-student application.
- . The scholarship is for up to 4 years (8 semesters) at Wingate as long as students maintain a GPA consistent with our academic standards
- The scholarship is applied to a student's financial aid after all other institutional, federal and state aid have been applied toward tuition.
- · The scholarship can be used for any undergraduate program (not just certain majors.)
- Scholarship recipients are responsible for the costs of room, board and a meal plan if they live on campus (average additional cost of \$10K per year).
- . The scholarship is not limited to a certain number of recipients each year. Any student who meets the qualifications is eligible.
- · Although it is not an income-based scholarship, families are required to complete the FAFSA or a financial responsibility form, to be eligible
- pathway.
- . Students must be enrolled full-time at Wingate (12 or more credit hours) to receive the scholarship.

Gateway to Wingate Tips

- Plan your courses. Work with your community college advisor and Wingate to ensure that your courses will transfer toward your major
- · Visit Wingate University's campus.
- . To receive a schedule that best fits your academic goals, submit your enrollment deposit early.

- Textile Pioneer Week: July 14-19 (Open to students from Tier 1 or 2 counties only)


