Internet Safety

As schools, including Wiggin Street, move towards 21st century learning practices including the use of Chromebooks, Ipads, and Google Classroom as well as a variety of on-line practice programs and testing systems, it is important to stay focused on safety. In the past month, the principals and school social workers have had the opportunity to receive updated Threat Assessment training through Mount Vernon City Schools. In addition, teachers had some experiences with safety at their last teacher in-service day. It is apparent that we all do our best daily to stay abreast of news relating to Internet sites that students use to communicate with one another or to post threatening information. At Wiggin Street, we have worked hard to help students understand the responsibilities that go along with the privilege of learning with technology at school. Here are some things you should be aware of when talking with your student about Internet safety at school:

- *All students have a unique login and password for their computer use at school. They should never share that password with anyone else. If they think their password may have become compromised, they should report it to a trusted adult immediately.
- *Cyberbullying on school devices is a violation of the student code of conduct and could result in the removal of computer privileges or disciplinary action at school. Cyberbullying includes sending, posting, or sharing negative, harmful, false, or mean content about someone else. It can include sharing personal or private information about someone else causing embarrassment or humiliation. Some cyberbullying crosses the line into unlawful or criminal behavior.
- *Hacking into other students' accounts. No student should ever access another student's personal computer information. Changing icons, homework assignments, etc. is a violation of the computer code of conduct and could result in removal of privileges or disciplinary action.
- *Threatening another student, group of students, or the school via the Internet is a severe violation of the student code of conduct and is illegal. Students who participate in this type of behavior will receive disciplinary action at school and will likely have to speak with a representative of the juvenile justice system.

While we monitor our computer use at school very carefully, it is important that parents also monitor their child's computer access at home and that all members of the school community use the rule of "if you see something, say something" to help keep children safe at school.


