NOTE on 2024: Due to the large number of outstanding marks in 2024, we investigated to be assured the course was a legitimate 5k. According to the Race Director on 27 November 2024, YES, the course is legit.

Why are the 1976 and 1978 5k courses suspect? Consider this: The seasons on either side of them (1975, 1977, 1979) average not a single runner in the 14:00 minute range, 5 running in the 15:00s and 49 in the 16:00s. The decade which follows show similar performance ranges.

However, those numbers were abruptly improved in 1976 (2-14:00s, 26-15:00s, 62-16:00s) and 1978 (10-14:00s, 73-15:00s, 54-16:00s). Most athletes who ran consecutive States were unable to come close to their standout mark of 1976 or 1978, and the track times they ran following the questionable season are not consistent with the standout XC times. Even the race management of the time called the course accuracy into question.

As for the 2019 season where 50 girls ran in the 18:00-range and 19 in the 17:00 range, and 54 boys in the 15:00-range, the meet director says the course was 70m-90m short.
