CONTEXT	The focus of this task is to assess students' ability to research and analyse information of Natural Hazards and extend this understanding to demonstrate an understanding of how the hazard has impacted Australian communities.

DESCRIPTION OF ACTIVITIES

Part A – Using the scaffold provided, students must select and research a natural hazard that has occurred in Australia, focusing on the causes and impacts of the natural hazard.

Part B - Consider if this natural hazard were to take place in your local area. In groups, work as part of a team to compile newspaper articles to report on the *Natural Hazard*. The articles need to be planned and presented as an A3 newspaper spread. Each *reporter* will need to include background information, graphics, comparisons with similar disasters in Australia including responses and rescue efforts.

- Outlines and explains the processes and impacts of a natural hazard
- Presents a two-page (A3) newspaper feature that reflects outstanding research and understanding of natural hazards and includes appropriate graphics
- Analyses knowledge of civics and citizenship through the role of individuals, groups and government in times of dealing with a natural hazard.

Part A - Natural Disaster Research

Your research should address the following areas:

- Identify the natural disaster
- Identify the date the disaster occurred
- Provide a location that was affected by the disaster. Latitude and longitude and a map (implementing BOLTSS) should be provided.
- Outline the causes of the disaster
- Outline the impacts of the disaster

Part B - Newspaper Report

As a reporter for your local newspaper you must work in a team to prepare a two-page (A3) newspaper feature covering the natural hazard.

Choose one of the following hazards to affect your local area:

- earthquake
- severe storm
- bushfire
- flood
- cyclone
- drought.

Be mindful of the places in Australia where these natural hazards are likely to occur.

The newspaper article must include:

Outline of the natural hazard	general reporting of the natural hazard
Pictures of the natural hazard	you can either use generic pictures or be creative and photoshop photos of your local area
Cause of hazard	some background information on how this type of natural hazard happens, including diagrams
Impacts of the natural hazard	In relation to:
Response to the hazard	descriptions of rescue efforts and responses by individuals, groups and governments to help ease the crisis
Historical comparisons	comparisons with similar natural hazards in Australia
